KVHA Mite Tornadoes Top KCHA Outlaws 14-2

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA 24 October, 2009 – The KVHA Mite Tornadoes skated to another convincing victory on Saturday, defeating the KCHA Outlaws 14-2 on home ice. The Tornadoes used both a balanced scoring attack and smothering defense to dominate both shots on goal (30-9) as well as time of possession. The Tornadoes have now scored an incredible 38 goals in 3 games, while surrendering just 10. 12 players for Kent Valley have now scored a point!

Jake Sordahl and Danny Smith both scored hat tricks, with Smith recording his third hat trick in a row – a hat trick of hat tricks! Trevor Mertel and Zach Johnston both added two. Zach's goals were the first of his season and he had a brilliant "hustle" assist on a third, skating hard to get onside as Oliver Carlson came into the zone on the way to his third goal of the year.

Zach's first goal came off a beautiful two pass assist – Danny Smith to Trevor Mertel to Zach – and his second was a full speed rush down the left side of the ice culminating in a strong shot that beat the Outlaw goaltender high.

Also appearing for the first time on the scoring sheet this year was Noah Koester with an assist on Kemper Terry's goal. Terry continues to be a well rounded threat in the offensive zone adding 2 more assists to his season tally.

The Tornado defense played another incredible game – limiting the Outlaws to just 9 shots on goal and only 1 in the second period. The pairings – Chase Pagan / Gage Gessner, Oliver Carlson / Noah Koester, and Andrew Alonzo / Davis Fjeld – continue to play disciplined, tough defense. Notable is both their efficient, effective clearing of the defensive zone and their strong play inside the attacking zone.

Like sentinels on the point, the boys make a great contribution to the offense by both pinching the blue line - keeping the puck in the attacking zone and allowing the talented Tornado forwards to work the puck in front of the goal – and in their quick recovery and capture of pucks in the neutral zone. Tornado defense have now contributed twelve points to the scoring sheet in 3 games.

Brett Jenkins backstopped the Tornadoes in goal – picking up his third win – making 7 saves on 9 shots.

Jack Rector scored both goals for the KCHA Outlaws.

Lynnwood Ice Arena, Lynnwood, WA 24 October, 2009 – Rolling in to Lynnwood 3 players down (2 on Defense!) with a hard-hitting reputation preceding them, the winless PeeWee Hurricanes used smart play-making teamwork, excellent fore-check and an awesome penalty kill to challenge the SJHA Blades to a hard-fought, exciting tug-of-war that finished in a 2-2 draw.

The Blades opened up the scoring midway through the 1st on a puck that just trickled in from the blocker-side corner shadows to get away from goalie Ben Cary. But shortly afterwards Hurricane Dennis Zaks answered with some crafty stick handling from the neutral zone, threading the defense (D) through the middle to swing left and wrist a shot

catcher-side from the circle as a Blades defender bore down, potting his first goal of the season.

The Hurricane offense really kicked in then with solid rushes and a few breakaways spearheaded by Zaks and Camden Mallery - both of whom picked the Blades D like a lock and kept the goalie alert all game. The Blades defense had their hands full with those two!

Neutral zone play for the Hurricanes was impressive with first year PeeWees Sierra Sanabria, Joey DeRosa, Ryan Atkins and Caelin Byrnes taking turns interrupting the Blades passing game to get a stick on the puck and pass it down ice to a breaking forward.

The Blades lit the lamp again at the end of the 1st period to go up 2-1 when goalie Cary lost sight of the puck in net-front traffic where it pushed in the five-hole. But after that the Hurricane D owned their zone to shut down further Blades scoring.

First year Emily Atkins stayed calm, cool and collected to hold up the blue line as time and time again she was faced with an odd man rush or breakaway situation - at one point taking a smart hooking penalty to stop a breakaway. Hurricane parents applauded their approval loudly as she was escorted to the box. Second year Kyle Pirtilla worked the boards defensively like a pro, using his size to his advantage and winning 98% of the battles to then set up an offensive rush. His puck control and play making in the defensive zone were key components to the offensive success all day. Second years Jordan Wachter and Jacob Ray provided awesome open ice penalty-kill (PK) defense with good, hard, clean checks that made the Blades offense sit up and take notice!

The Hurricanes equalizing goal came in the 2nd from Camden Mallery when he was fed a neutral zone pass from Zaks to skate for the left side boards, push around the first Blades defender then break for the middle after the 2nd Blades D-man caught and edge and fell. Skating in front of the crease left to right untouched, the Blades goalie tried for a sprawling poke check that missed, then watched helplessly from the ice as, with a toe drag and backhand, Mallery netted his first goal of the season. The Hurricane momentum and enthusiasm became fully apparent as shortly thereafter, during a break in the action, techno music with a thumping beat filled the arena causing the ENTIRE Hurricane bench to throw their hands in the air and begin DANCING! As they jammed out the Hurricane parents joined them in a gleeful, fun, innocent, impromptu jam session worthy of any Kodak moment! One for the ages to be sure!

Hamstrung by penalties the Hurricanes seemed to spend most of the 2nd and 3rd periods on the PK, but remained calm, held their zone and turned the man disadvantage to an awesome shorthanded fore-check that never let up, often keeping the surprised Blades pinned down in their zone! Hurricane parents, on their feet, cheered loudly as the final two minutes slowly ticked away with the puck in the Hurricane zone and on the PK, where the tired Hurricane PK/defense dug in to a Blades offense that found a second wind, cycling the puck around the zone, putting several shots on goal that were blocked by excellent defensive positioning and Cary working the crease like a pro. Unable to quite clear the puck the Hurricanes held strong and never let up in the tug-of-war, keeping a Blades go-ahead game-winning goal at bay to notch the important tie.
