Wow, what a finish! And, how about Team Canada’s Jordan Eberle, two goals in the third period to tie it up for Team Canada and force the overtime.

Did you notice on Eberle’s tying goal in the 3rd period that he never looked at the goalie? He had his eyes on the winger coming in on the other side of the ice and kept his vision focused on that guy to distract Team USA’s goaltender Jack Campbell. Eberle waited patiently for Campbell to begin his move toward the incoming winger and then he fired a neat little wrist shot past Campbell’s right arm. He did that without ever taking his eyes off his teammate rushing in from the other side. Talk about amazing peripheral vision... What an awesome shot! I wonder how many times Eberle had to practice that move before he achieved perfection Tuesday night? It was magic!

There’s another interesting note about the 2010 IIHF World Junior Championships. Many of those Team USA and Team Canada players can be seen right here in Kent at ShoWare Center throughout the Seattle Thunderbirds’ hockey season. Many of Team USA’s and Team Canada’s players came from the rosters of WHL teams that play the T-Birds in ShoWare Center. Teams like the Brandon Wheat Kings, Calgary Hit Men, Kelowna Rockets, Moose Jaw Warriors, Portland Winterhawks, Regina Pats and Spokane Chiefs. WHL Coaches were also involved with World Juniors. Willie Desjardins, Team Canada’s Head Coach is General Manager and Head Coach of the Medicine Hat Tigers. Team USA’s Video Coach is Jay Varady, an Assistant Coach with the Everett Silver Tips.

The tournament attracted the top 5 Vancouver-area teams as well as a top Edmonton team. The Rainiers ground out victories in their first three round-robin games against Abbotsford, Seattle, and Semiahmoo. In each game, the Rainiers either trailed or were tied in the 3rd period. The players dug deep and played their best hockey when it counted to earn a spot in the semi-finals.

The Rainiers renewed their rivalry with NSWC in the semi-finals. The Rainiers put together their three best periods of the season and dominated the crowd favorite in every aspect of the game. The Rainiers outshot NSWC 47-22 and were physically dominant winning the majority of the puck battles. Once again, the Rainiers found themselves tied entering the 3rd period. Kingsgate Ice Arena, Kirkland, WA 3 January, 2010 – The Midget Tornadoes allowed their opponents just one goal in each of their first three games this past weekend. However, SnoKing White, a non-NPSHL League team, turned the tables on the Kent Valley Midgets and allowed the Tornadoes just one goal in game four while the SnoKing phantom team got two of their own.

The origin of the SnoKing White team is still unknown. SnoKing fields two Midget rec teams in the NPSHL League, SnoKing Green and SnoKing Grey. So, where have they been hiding this team? And, why? Kind of makes you wonder...

Game 1: Kent Valley Tornadoes (5) vs. Bremerton Outlaws (1) - The Tornadoes played the Bremerton Outlaws even up until the middle of the second period when Tanner Coughlin took advantage of Bremerton penalty scored an unassisted goal. That goal seemed to break the ice for the Tornadoes. Tommy Peebles scored early in the third with

assists from Coughlin and Kyle Miller-Smith. Bremerton trimmed the Tornadoes lead to 1 goal three minutes later when the Outlaw's Craig Carlson scored an unassisted goal. The one-goal gap lasted less than a minute as Taylor Birkeland set up Kyle Miller-Smith with his patented pass out front to Miller-Smith who hammered it home for the Tornadoes third goal. Less than a minute later Paul Pinkoske took advantage of a tipped puck from Tommy Peebles for a power play goal and a 4 to 1 lead. Pinkoske scored again near the end of the third period when Taylor Birkeland worked his magic to the side of the net and set up Pinkoske for the score.

Game 2: Kent Valley Tornadoes (6) vs. Seattle Jr. Badgers (1) – Justin Hill-Sellers was "Mr. Playmaker" in this game. Hill-Sellers figured in 4 of the Tornadoes' 6 goals setting up Taylor Birkeland, Kyle Miller-Smith (2 goals) and Tommy Peebles with nifty little passes in front of the net where the puck was hammered past the Seattle Jr. goal tender for scores.

Game 3: Kent Valley Tornadoes (3) vs. SnoKing Green (1) – Paul Pinkoske got the Tornadoes off to an early lead midway through the first period with assists from Taylor Birkeland and Ben Fleming. SnoKing tied it up in the second period. Paul Pinkoske got the go-ahead goal at 11:54 of the third period on assists from Taylor Birkeland & Ben Fleming. With 6:51 remaining in the game, Justin Hill-Sellers got one of Taylor Birkeland's patented passes to score the final tally of the game.

The Tornadoes net minder Joshua Severeid had his third straight game with a save rate above 90%. Severeid improved with each game stopping 92% in game one, 94% in game two and 95% in game three. Severeid didn't face many shots in games one (13) and two (17), but SnoKing Green upped the pressure in game 3 and managed 22 shots on goal with Severeid turning away 21 for his best performance of the series, 95%.
