Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. January 4, 2014 Coach Jeff Ferguson was hoping the holiday break provided his ice warriors with some well-deserved rest without suffering from #FOMO or compromising the developing hockey skills they've been honing all season as his KVHA Tornadoes team took to home ice to face-off against the second-placed SJHA Badgers in league play. The Tornadoes definitely faced a daunting task on their first game out of the break having to face one of the very top teams in the league in the Badgers, who ranked in the top few teams in both goals for and goals against this season. But rested and ready for battle they were as this game did not disappoint, while the fans cheered on the Tornadoes who took a "W" in their tenth regular-season game by an impressive shut-out score of 4-0! Hockey 1946-47 Chronicle – Remembering the Rocket!

In 1946-47, Montreal's Maurice Richard regained his power as a goal-scoring devil. With Elmer Lach laid up for much of the season, Buddy O'Connor filled in at center, shoveling pucks across to the Rocket who put them to good use. With strong goaltenders working across the NHL, Richard was hard-pressed to repeat his record 50-in-50 season, but he managed 45 goals in the 60-game campaign and added six more in the playoffs.

"He can shoot from any angle. You can play him for a shot to the upper corner and the Rocket wheels and fires a backhand to the near, lower part of the net."

"When he skated in on the net, the Rocket's eyes would shine like a pair of searchlights. It was awesome to see him coming at you."

Referee William Leroy "The Big Whistle" Chadwick was the first American born On-Ice Official to serve in the NHL and the first to utilize hand signals to indicate what penalty he was calling. With the hand signals, both the players and the fans knew immediately what call had been made. The NHL made such signals official for the 1946-47 season.
