The game wasn't an exhibition game between two Kent Valley Hockey Association (KVHA) teams where the outcome was only for bragging rights; it was a league game between two KVHA rivals for points in the NPSHL league standings. Lynnwood Ice Arena, Lynnwood, WA. January 5, 2013 – Coach Jeff Ferguson took his KVHA Tornadoes team to Lynnwood Ice Arena Saturday to face-off against the SJHA Blades in league play. The Tornadoes were hoping for a repeat of their last NPSHL home game performance before the holidays, when they shut-out the SJHA Bulldogs at KVIC two weeks ago. This game did not disappoint with the Tornadoes winning their tenth regular-season game by an impressive shut-out score of 3-0!

Period 1 - The Tornadoes didn't waste any time to strike first against the Blades and take the early lead by scoring the first goal of the game on a shot from Steven Rosenquist(#5), assisted by Steven Bautista(#11) & Rickey Campbell(#12).
