The True Meaning of Winning the Cup:

"I have been fortunate to have won six Stanley Cups as a player, but winning that first one in 1980 was the most memorable. I remember the exact moment like it was yesterday. I was on the bench between shifts, and I saw Lorne Henning pass the puck to John Tonelli, who in turn passed to Bobby Nystrom, who shot it past Philadelphia goalie Pete Peeters for the overtime game winner. It was the greatest moment of my hockey career, without a doubt. When that red light went off I was officially a Stanley Cup champion."
