Facing a grueling three-game schedule Saturday that included back-to-back games, the Tornadoes remained in charge throughout every game, but ended up with a loss and a tie as the clock wound down and their defense collapsed. Overall, the Tornadoes won two, lost one and tied one in Wenatchee.
