Hockey is an expensive sport and we all recognize the fact that parents of a hockey player(s) make tremendous financial sacrifices for their children to be able play the exciting and rewarding game of hockey. We look to fundraising, in the form of our annual auction, to supplement the program we so dearly love and enjoy.

Back in the day when both of my children were playing youth hockey, I would often tell people, *"We don't have a boat, we don't have a motor home and we don't vacation in Hawaii. We have two kids who play hockey and we enjoy it with them."* Our vacations were hockey tournaments and weekend hockey games in Portland, Spokane, Wenatchee, Port Moody, Burnaby, Port Coquitlam and other hot beds of hockey around the Pacific Northwest. The memory of those hockey days and the benefits our children and family realized through participation in hockey far outweigh any enjoyment we might have gotten out of a boat, motor home or vacations in Hawaii. Yes, we struggled to make the ice payments, replace hockey skates and other hockey equipment, and pay for power skating sessions and summer hockey schools. Our hockey teams often had commercial sponsors that helped cover some of the costs for team jerseys, socks and goalie gear. We sold candy bars as a fundraiser, the proceeds of which went to help cover a portion of our tournament fees and little else.

The story is no different today than it was back in the 70's and 80's. The cost of playing hockey was, and still is, huge. However, the benefits are equally large. Our annual auction may not be the best way to support our program. Some of our members dread the auction while others support it with enthusiasm. Even those most intimately involved with the auction sometimes question the tremendous volunteer effort it takes to stage the auction. They too agree that we need to explore others ways to reduce the cost of participation in this great sport. However, for now, it's our primary fundraiser and we need to support it... Besides, it beats the hell out of selling candy bars.

I hope to see you Saturday night at Emerald Downs. Bring a friend, relative, neighbor or co-worker; preferably one that has a credit card with a high limit and low balance. There's going to be some real bargains on the auction block. Bidding for our future starts at 5:30pm.
