### ***Kent Valley Tornadoes' Rosenquist Leads as Steinocher Defends in NPSHL 2 to 1 Victory over SnoKing Blue***

**Kingsgate Ice Arena, Kirkland, WA. January 18, 2013** – The KVHA Tornadoes team faced off against the SKAHA Jr. Tbirds Blue team on Friday night at Kingsgate Ice Arena in Kirkland for their 13th game of the NPSHL season. Most people would hope that 13 would turn out lucky – but there was no luck involved in this game. Instead, true grit and determination prevailed as the Tornadoes quickly took full advantage of the Blue on their home ice with a relentless attack, demonstrating their solid skills by holding the Blue to just one goal and scoring two of their own to take the eventual win! It is noteworthy that they made the trip up to Kingsgate missing members of both their offensive and defensive units. This, coupled with the fact that the Tbirds Blue are the highest ranked Sno-King team this season and sport a roster filled with extremely big, physical players - the game presented more than a challenge right from the get-go. Missing Max Mudge(#15) and Michael

Geddes(#7) posed significant challenges to the Tornadoes as well, but the team rallied together and doubled their efforts to fill-in the holes and keep us a tough team to play!

**Period 1** - The Tornadoes aggressively took to the ice with a fierce competitiveness, wasting no time to gain the upper-hand. Within the first minutes of play, Steven Rosenquist(#5) would score from an assist by Jake Ferguson(#8) & Luke Pizzey(#9). The Blue did their best to defend against a strong Tornadoes team whose core of superb players have been honing their great hockey skills all season long. Unfortunately for the Blue, time ran out and just as the scoreboard indicated, the Tornadoes owned the 1st period to make a significant impact on the SKAHA team.

**Period 2** - Minutes into the 2nd period, the Blues netted their first goal, making the score 1 to 1 to tie-up the game. Undeterred, the Tornadoes got back to work, focusing on positional play and offensive maneuvers. The turbulent struggle continued for possession of the puck. However, no other goals were scored by either team due to the strong defensive skills shown by both goalies! Remarkably, the Tornadoes' depth for the night suffered another significant hit when Luke Pizzey(#9) had to leave the game after the first period (for an important family commitment), causing our boys to dig even deeper to muster up the additional strength needed for extra shifts - leaving everything they had on the ice in the name of TEAM Tornadoes!

**Period 3** - The exhilarating battle continued well into the 3rd period as the Tornadoes countered an attack to break the tie and take the lead. However, the Tbirds Blue could sense the Tornadoes were tired and began throwing everything they could at the Tornadoes' net. In addition, the Blue had many big, physically strong players who could really throw hard shots at the net and did so relentlessly in the last period. Yet, Cameron Steinocher(#19) stood large in front of the Tornadoes' cage and denied the Tbirds any further celebrations that night! Plus to add to it, and with only 25.6 seconds left on the clock, Steven Rosenquist(#5) led the charge by scoring his second goal of the game with another assist by Jake Ferguson(#8). Great offensive performance boys - but next time, don't cut it so close!

**Summary** - In the end, the thrilling outcome of this game favored KVHA Tornadoes as they beat the SKAHA Jr. Tbirds Blue in league play Friday. The Tornadoes dug deep and never gave up against the Blues and defeated them by a final score of 2 to 1. The Tornadoes fired 13 shots on the Blues' goal while the Blues put an equally impressive 12 shots on the Tornadoes' net. Way to go Tornadoes defense! Tornadoes goalie Cameron Steinocher(#19) stopped 11 of 12 Blues' shots - an impressive 92% save rate. Excellent defense, Cam! Congratulations to both teams on a very breathtaking and entertaining game - where the excitement went right up to the very last seconds of the match! Next up, the Tornadoes will face another Sno-King team - the SKAHA Black on home ice on Saturday, January 26th. Good luck, Tornadoes!
