



# **KVHA Teams Return to NPSHL and PNAHA League play**

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA – KVHA News for 26 January, 2011** – The Kent Valley Bantam Selects had a great game going last Saturday with the Tri-Cities Jr. Americans. The Selects led by one goal until the Jr. Americans tied the game at 2 to 2 with 5:21 remaining to play in the third period. One would expect that a game like this one would go right down to the final horn and end up as a tie or one goal win, at best, for one of the teams. But, strange things can happen in the closing minutes of a tight game and that’s exactly what happened in this game. With 3:24 remaining to play, the Jr. Americans’ Aaron Questad took a pass from a teammate and scored the winning goal. But, Questad was not finished... He scored again with 0:49 remaining and tapped in another with 0:13 remaining to earn a Hat Trick in 3 minutes and 11 seconds. The timing is pretty remarkable. Three goals in 3 minutes and 11 seconds right when his team needed them and the Selects didn’t. Questad is not a stranger to scoring 3 goals in PNAHA league games. He scored a hat trick against the Wenatchee Jr. Wild on October 16<sup>th</sup>, scored a hat trick against the Kent Valley Selects when they met on October 30<sup>th</sup> and he tagged the Everett Silvertips with three goals on January 8<sup>th</sup>. But, the three goals scored in the third period Saturday were his quickest of the season.

Upon learning of Aaron Questad’s three goals in the third period of Saturday’s game, I wondered how that accomplishment stacked up against Kent Valley players, current and former. So, I checked our KVHA Record Book. It turns out we have a number of players who have scored 3 goals in one period:

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA 22 January, 2011** – A strong Everett Kodiak defense and excellent goal tending highlighted the early part of this game for the visitors. The Kent Valley Tornadoes fired 10 shots on the Kodiak's goal in the first period, the Tornadoes' highest shot output of any period, but nothing got past Everett's Andrew Tworowski defending the Kodiak's goal. The Kodiaks defense began to weaken in the second period as the Tornadoes maintained an intense offensive pace and scored on 2 of 9 shots. The Tornadoes went on to score on 4 of 9 shots in the third period for a final score of 6 to 0 over the Everett Kodiaks. Kent Valley's Chase Pagan stood in goal for the Tornadoes and earned a shutout in the process. Trevor Mertel scored a Hat Trick to continue his scoring streak.

However, the highlight of this game was the second goal of the game. Maxwell Mudge scored his first career goal at 6:21 of the second period with assists from Trevor Mertel and Quinton Gessner. ## ***Kent Valley Squirt Tornadoes Tame Outlaws, 7 to 1***

**Bremerton Ice Arena, Bremerton, WA 22 January, 2011** – The Kent Valley Tornadoes beat the Kitsap County Outlaws Black 7-1 in a Saturday matinee in Bremerton. Lexi Doner Jr. and Kemper Terry led the way with 2 goals each. Danny Smith, Oliver Carlson and Jake Sordahl each scored – and Dylan Herzog added 3 assists. Jesper Miquel was dominating in goal, stopping 18 of 19 shots. With just 4 games left in the regular season the Tornadoes are now 12-0 with a perfect 36 points (24 victory points and 12 sportsmanship points).

After an eye-opening home loss to the Sno-King House All-Stars, 2-0, the Tornadoes responded with their best game of the year. Balanced scoring, tremendous skating, heads up movement of the puck, and a “pass first” mentality were notable – as were the sustained attacks in the Outlaw zone.

The Tornadoes – led by Aaron Dunning as game captain and Brett Jenkins and Noah Koester as the alternates – started the game strong quickly getting the puck into the Outlaw zone and putting lots of pressure on the goal. After several good chances it was Dylan Herzog who made the play of the day with a hard rush down the right side. Herzog, who carries the puck like an NFL fullback, came charging in, only to be tripped up as he reached the circle, falling down on the ice. Instead of giving up on the play, he calmly used his elbows to prop himself up and slingshot a centering pass with his stick to a waiting Oliver Carlson who slammed home the first goal of the day. Dylan calmly got up and celebrated with the team (tucking in his cape as he skated over).

Kemper Terry scored the second goal with a strong wrister from 20 feet which beat the outstretched blocker of the goaltender to give the Tornadoes a 2-0 lead.

The second period belonged to Lexi Doner Jr. Lexi scored two goals in the period, working tirelessly to find open ice and demonstrating some strong puckhandling skills. Both goals were nice, but the second, in particular, showed off his ability to shoot – head up – into a tight opening, beating the goalie just above the glove. Lexi also picked up a two minute penalty for tripping, leaving him an assist shy of the “Gordie Howe” Squirt hat trick.

The third period started slow, but Caleb Travis scored half-way into the period after appearing to have the puck frozen. The Tornadoes responded by reeling off two quick goals – one by Terry on a classic break-away and deke to the stick side – and the other on a “long bomb” pass from Dylan Herzog to a waiting Danny Smith, who calmly skated in and beat the goaltender with a nifty fade over the pads. The Tornadoes finished the scoring as Terry squeezed a pass through traffic to a rushing Jake Sordahl who used his ‘risin wrister’ to roll a 7 for the final score.

Coach Harry Smith was pleased after the game, commenting on the heads up play, the hard skating, the discipline to stay in positions, and the movement of the puck from stick to stick.

The Tornadoes return home on Saturday, January 29th for their first game against SnoKing Jr. T-Birds Grey.

Kent Valley's Carson Zadina faced 39 shots on goal and turned away 34 of them for a save rate of 87% matching Seattle Jr's Cody Wong in save percentage.

Sunday's game two was frustrating for the NW Admirals. Johnnie White scored a Hat Trick for the Admirals while Kent Valley got one goal from Nicky Pokrzywinski with an assist from Elliot Plourde. With a roster of only eight players and a goalie there is plenty of opportunity for double shifts. Ben Cary earned a “Star of the Game” nomination for his performance in goal. Cary faced 19 shots on goal and turned away 16 of them for a save rate of 84%, 9 percentage points better than the Seattle Jr. Goalkeeper (6 of 8 for 75%.) Cary’s excellent performance combined with his teammates’ strong defense kept the game close. JD Dunn scored the Tornadoes’ first goal at 9:25 in the first period on an assist from Jake Ryerson to tie the game at 1 and 1. Jacob Ray scored the Tornadoes’ second goal and final goal of the game with 43 seconds remaining in the second period with assists from Kyle Pirttila and Mason Conner to cut the Seattle Jr. lead to one goal. The two teams played even throughout the third period with the Eagles holding tight on their one-goal lead to win the game 3 to 2.
