And what a spectacular environment designed to showcase the grit and game of this quick-paced sport than in an outdoor rink! With a bunch of thrills, chills and spills, it was hockey at its best! While it was disappointing that the tournament was cancelled at the last minute, it was gracious of our hosts to invite us to still play and have some fun. And boy did we have fun!
