



Danny Lorenz Surrenders WHL Career Saves Record to the T-Bird's Calvin Pickard

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA., January 28, 2012 – Sunday night, January 22nd, 2012, at the Pacific Coliseum in Vancouver, British Columbia, Seattle Thunderbirds goalie Calvin Pickard established a new WHL record for career saves in the T-Birds 3-2 loss to the Vancouver Giants.

Pickard made 42 saves in the game to give him 6,959 career saves. Pickard passed former T-Bird Danny Lorenz, who had 6,958 career saves with the T-Birds from 1986 to 1990, to establish the new WHL record for career saves.

Pickard has appeared in 217 games with the T-Birds. He has averaged 32 saves a game for his career.

Pickard, who played 58:52 Sunday night, also set the T-Birds record for most career minutes played by a goaltender. Pickard has now played 12,639 minutes, which is five minutes more than Lorenz, who played 12,634 minutes with the T-Birds from 1986 to 1990.

Pickard, by passing Lorenz, is now third in the WHL record book for most career minutes played by a goaltender. Kyle Moir played 12,774 minutes with the Swift Current Broncos from 2002 to 2007 and Kurtis Mucha played 13,708 minutes with the Portland Winterhawks and Kamloops Blazers from 2005 to 2010.

Lorenz presented Pickard with a commemorative plaque at Saturday's Seattle Thunderbirds game. Seattle Thunderbird fans were pleased to see Lorenz come to center ice to make the presentation. Fans honored the pair with a standing ovation.

In a déjà vu moment, only 20 seconds apart, Caleb Chaloner(#3) scored 2 consecutive goals with both assists by Aidan Herring(#14) to tie up the game. Amazing shots, Caleb! Yet even with these goals, the outcome of this game wasn't determined until the last five minutes of the final period when the T-Birds Black scored to regain the lead. The score was tied three times during the game. The T-Birds Black held a one-goal lead twice while the Tornadoes tied it up three different times during the course of the game. But, it was the lead at the end that counted for the T-Birds Black.

Summary - The KVHA Mite Tornadoes dropped a closely played NPSHL match against the SJHA T-Birds Black team in league play on Saturday morning, losing by a final score of 6-4. While the Tornadoes showed their maturing skills at passing and positional play they simply ran out of time and just couldn't get a strong enough rally going against the T-Birds Black team.
