



KVHA News – Kent Valley Receives Thunderbird Community Sports Foundation Grant

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. Thursday, February 4, 2016 – Kent Valley Hockey Association's Learn to Play Program has received a \$4,500 grant from the Thunderbird Community Sports Foundation. The grant funds will be utilized to fund thirty (30) new sets of Learn to Play starter gear for its Learn to Play Hockey Program (LTP). The LTP program hopes to attract and serve boys and girls ages 4 to 10 in the greater Kent Valley, South King County and North Pierce County areas.



The aim of the LTP program is to provide parents with a low cost means of introducing their child to ice hockey. Starter gear sets are provided to skaters for a minimal fee and a refundable deposit. The average life of a set of LTP starter gear is approximately five years, meaning that approximately 20% of the inventory of starter gear needs to be replaced every year. A starter set includes all the hockey gear required by USA Hockey from head to toe; helmet to skates. Parents supply the mouth guard and athletic cup.

The Thunderbird Community Sports Foundation has partnered with the Thunderbirds Hockey Club to support and encourage youth participation in organized sports activities in our community, with an emphasis on youth minor hockey. This is accomplished by awarding funds through a grant process to deserving amateur and youth sports organizations to further their efforts by giving all kids a chance to play. The Foundation primarily raises funds by operating a 50/50 drawing and Jersey raffle at the Thunderbirds home games at ShoWare Center in Kent. However, as the Foundation grows, they look forward to engaging our community in other fundraising efforts to help as many athletes as possible.

The Thunderbird Community Sports Foundation has contributed over \$400,000 in support of a variety of youth sports in South Puget Sound region. Youth hockey organizations in the area, including KVHA, have received over \$90,000 since the creation of the Foundation in 2009.

Kent Valley Hockey Association applauds the efforts of the Thunderbird Community Sports Foundation in support of youth sports in the South Puget Sound region and thanks them for their generous support of our youth hockey program.
