



## ***KVHA News – Playoffs Just Around the Corner for Kent Valley Teams***

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. February 6, 2014** – It doesn't seem possible, but NPSHL Playoffs and PNAHA State Tournaments are just around the corner. NPSHL Playoffs will begin with the March 1<sup>st</sup> weekend with possible "play in" games (explained below) scheduled for the week prior. The NPSHL Playoff Format is described below:

### **NPSHL PLAYOFF FORMAT**

All teams competing in regular season play are required to play in the NPSHL Playoffs or Consolation Bracket. The Playoffs normally occur during the last 2 weeks of the season. **The Mite Age Division does not have Playoffs.** How a team places in the standings during the regular season will determine placement in the playoff schedule. The top 8 teams in each age division, Squirt through Midget, will play in the Banner Division for the Championship. Those teams placing lower than 8th place will participate in a consolation round. If there are only 9 teams in an age division, it is possible a "play in" game will be played where the 8th seed plays the 9th seed, winner will play the 1st seed and loser is eliminated from playoff contention. The Playoffs will be single-elimination, therefore, any team losing will be eliminated from the playoffs. The playoffs will utilize all ice from participating associations; therefore, a home game may not be played at your home ice as necessary. Adjustments may be made to account for a lower number of teams in any age division.

The PNAHA web site provided less information about the State Tournament. Here's what we found:

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. February 1, 2014** – On this Seahawks Super Bowl weekend, the KVHA PeeWee Tornadoes had more on their mind than the BIG football game as they kept quite busy with 2 NPSHL games! On Saturday, February 1st, they won the first one in another regular-season game at home by a thrilling score of 3 to 2 against the SKAHA Jr. Tbirds White (who have the 2nd highest scoring offense in the league). In an exciting rematch, the Tornadoes took full advantage of their home ice with relentless attacks, great passing and a solid performance that demonstrated their strong teamwork.

**Period 1** - After a very successful practice on the night before, the Tornadoes aggressively took to the ice with a fierce competitiveness, after almost 3 weeks off from NPSHL league play. However, as with their previous encounter with the Whites, their opponent had other

ideas and took advantage of the Tornado's lackluster start by getting on the scoreboard first. But that 1-goal lead wasn't enough to deter our boys who collectively united to get their own mojo going by living up to the Seahawks "I'M IN" affirmation ("to compete to be your best you"). No one did this better than Steven Rosenquist(#5) who scored 2 goals in the period. The first unassisted (with some sweet moves associated with it) and the second with an assist by Rickey Campbell(#4) in the waning minutes of the period. Fortunately, their strong defensive maneuvers prevailed as they held the lead as the period ended, preventing the Whites from scoring again to tie things up. Great teamwork, boys!

**Period 2** - As the 2nd period opened, Coach Ferguson encouraged them to keep the momentum going and their heads in the game. So the Tornadoes got back to work, focusing on positional play and offensive maneuvers, while trying to maintain the upper-hand with possession of that elusive puck. The fight for that control was intense throughout the period as the Tornadoes did an outstanding job on defense as well as offensive maneuvers. Even with power-play opportunities for both teams, neither could capitalize against the other. Consequently, as the period went on, the turbulent struggle did not equate to any more scoring as no other goals were netted by either team due to the strong defensive skills shown by both goalies! Great performance & competitiveness displayed by both teams!

**Period 3** - The fierce battle continued well into the 3rd period. Both teams did a great job to fend off their opponent's attacks and keep the puck moving....only until one team let up a bit was the other able to pounce. And that's just the opportunity the Tornadoes' Tyler Sherwood(#2) would need as he used unbelievable patience and showed excellent positional awareness, as did his linemates as all three forwards combined for a picture perfect tic-tac-toe scoring play with perfect passes leading up to net a spectacular shot, assisted by Maxwell Mudge(#15) & Drew Sherwood(#11). Just like in practice, Tyler's goal was a textbook perfect pass from Drew to Max in the corner, then Max back to Tyler who slid into the high slot area (just like our drills) and one-timed Max's pass cleanly into the twine! Impressive goal, Tyler! And impressive teamwork, boys! Regrettably, the boys took a break and allowed the Tbirds White to score a goal to get back in contention and on the scoreboard once again. Thankfully, time ran out for the Whites and just as the scoreboard indicated, the Tornadoes came away with another "W" in their pockets. Way to rally and keep the momentum going, boys - right up until the last horn sounded!!

**Summary** - In the end, the exhilarating outcome of this game favored KVHA Tornadoes as they narrowly beat the SKAHA Jr. Tbirds White in league play Saturday - leaving everything they had on the ice with their TEAM Tornadoes "I'M IN" mentality. What a way to dig deep and never give up against the physically large Tbirds White team - and to defeat them in a closely played match by a final score of 3 to 2. Although the Tornadoes fired half as many shots on the Whites' goal as they did on ours, what mattered were those that made it through - - - and that was the difference in the game. Way to go Tornadoes defense! Kudos to goalie Tyler Roberts(#35) who put on the armor and turned away 21 of their 23 shots - earning a 91% save rate! Excellent defense, Tyler! **Comcast Ice Arena, Everett, WA. February 2, 2014** – It was GAME day – and not the usual one that surrounds hockey. With the Seahawks Super Bowl fever pitch at an all-time high in the Seattle area, it would be hard for most to concentrate on a hockey game. But not our ice warriors, aka the KVHA PeeWee Tornadoes, who took full advantage of their opponent's BIG HOUSE, playing at the Everett Silvertips game arena on Sunday, February 2nd when they faced a poised, EYH Kodiaks team for their 13th game of the NPSHL season! However, most people perceive 13 as unlucky – but there was no luck involved in this game. Instead, true grit and determination prevailed as the Tornadoes quickly took full advantage of the Kodiaks on their home ice with a relentless attack, demonstrating their solid skills by preventing them from even scoring while posting another shut-out to take the eventual win! (Even though the Tornadoes knew that this match was not going to be a walk in the park as the Everett Kodiaks had just recently lost a nail biter to the only other undefeated team in our league, the T-Birds Grey, just weeks before.) While it may be considered a statistical oddity, it is still noteworthy that the Tornadoes beat the other Everett team by the same score back on November 2nd! What are the odds of that repeat performance?!

**Period 1** - Just like the last few games the Tornadoes have played, it was apparent that a distinct pattern has erupted of late (much to the chagrin of our coaches and fans). Instead of starting the contest with the momentum of an F5 tornado, the Tornadoes seem to take their time sizing-up their competition. However, despite their slow start, the Tornadoes didn't let that distract them from creating a rock-solid defense, preventing the Kodiaks from capitalizing and agitating their opponents at every turn! Consequently, the electrifying battle between both teams was evident as neither team scored during the period. It was exciting to witness such a great exchange between two competitive teams! Great performance by both teams!

**Period 2** - As the 2nd period opened, the Tornadoes wouldn't let the scoreless first period determine their fate in this heated contest and quickly got back to work. However, things became dramatically different in this period as the Tornadoes finally found that other gear they were missing in the previous period and didn't waste any more time to evoke mass destruction on their opponent and get this game off to a dream start. With 13:29 posted on the clock, Sean Smith(#14) would score the first goal of the game, a spectacular unassisted shot to the net! As the period continued and tensions built, both teams fought hard for possession of that elusive puck. However, midway through the period, it was evident that the Kodiaks struggled to collect themselves and the Tornadoes responded with a goal by Jake Ferguson(#8), assisted by Steven Rosenquist(#5) & Sean Smith(#14). The turbulent struggle continued once again for possession of the puck. With less than 2 minutes of play, the Tornadoes would score once again on an unassisted shot from Steven Rosenquist(#5). And they weren't done yet when just over 40 seconds later, Sean Smith(#14) would score his second goal of the period, assisted by Jake Ferguson(#8) & Steven Rosenquist(#5). At just over 40 seconds into the 3rd period, Lane Eriks(#19) would score another Tornadoes goal, with an amazing shot, assisted by Jack Jones(#24) & Nate Dunn(#9). And the hits just kept on coming.....when only 28

seconds later, Steven Rosenquist(#5) would take the breakaway shot and score his second goal of the night. Not wanting the scoring blitz to stop, Steven Rosenquist(#5) would follow that goal with one more to complete his "Hat Trick", assisted by Maxwell Mudge(#15). With just over 1 minute left on the clock and the clock winding down, Lane Eriks(#19) would score his own second goal of the night, assisted by Alex Britten(#3). WOW, what a rally, boys!
