Kent Valley Squirt Tornadoes Continue Their Banner Season with Tri-Cities Desert Classic Tournament Win

Toyota Arena, Kennewick, WA. February 3, 2013 – Kent Valley’s Squirt Tornadoes won five straight tournament games between Friday February 1st and Sunday February 3rd to win the 2012/2013 Tri-Cities Desert Classic Tournament. Following are the details of each game. Congratulations to the Squirt Tornadoes on a great tournament victory.

Game 1 - KVHA Squirt Tornadoes (2) vs. PJH Black Knights (1): On Friday, February 1st, Coach Jeff Ferguson took his KVHA Squirt Tornadoes team on the road to Central Washington to compete in the Desert Classic Tournament in Tri-Cities at both the TRAC and Toyota Ice Arenas for their second tournament of the season. While the TRAC Ice Arena may be difficult to find, it made no difference to the Tornadoes who came ready to rumble for their first game at this facility. Because of this, Ferguson and his team proudly came away with their first win of the weekend tournament after facing a tough PJH Black Knights team.

Period 1 - The 1st period was highlighted with a heated battle for possession and persistent attacks from both teams. The close match-up between the two teams was evident. So much so, that both teams prevented the other from capitalizing on offensive maneuvers and potential scoring opportunities. Throughout the period, it was evident that the players were working well together getting into position and vying for the puck. In the end, the strong exchange between both teams was evident as neither team scored during the period. It was exciting to witness such a great battle for the puck between two competitive teams! Great performance by both teams!

Period 2 - Only a few minutes into the 2nd period, the Tornadoes stepped it up and took the lead early on a goal scored by Steven Rosenquist(#5), assisted by Jake Ferguson(#8). Summary - Ultimately, the KVHA Squirt Tornadoes won against a strong Portland Black Knights team in tournament play on Friday. The Tornadoes defeated the Knights by a final score of 2 to 1. Goalie Cameron Steinocher(#19) had a solid performance saving 11 out of 12 shots for a 92% save rate. Great job, Cam! Hopefully as the tournament play goes on, we will see continued improvement in the Tornadoes skills. Game 2 - KVHA Squirt Tornadoes (7) vs. Tri-Cities Squirt Phantoms (2): As the sun was rising, the KVHA Squirt Tornadoes were hoping the beautiful sunshine (usually absent in Seattle) was a sign of glorious things to come. And that's just how the day began... The KVHA Squirt Tornadoes rose on Saturday, February 2nd, to face their first local team at the Toyota Ice Arena for this second action-packed day of hockey at the Desert Classic Tournament in Tri-Cities. At O'dark-hundred (8:00am) that day, the KVHA Squirt Tornadoes went up against the TCAHA Phantoms in tournament play and simply overpowered them to take the eventual win.

Period 1 - The KVHA Tornadoes went toe-to-toe during the 1st period against a strong Tri-City Phantoms team. Within the first minute of play, Steven Rosenquist(#5) would score his first goal of the night, assisted by Jake Ferguson(#8). The match-play seemed to get more intense with every tic of the clock...and then the magic began. At 4:46 into the first period, Reid Shelden(#3) scored his first goal of the season with a spectacular shot from the blue line. Only minutes later, another unassisted goal would be scored by Luke Pizzey(#9). And the momentum kept going from there.... Period 2 - As the 2nd period opened, the Phantoms had a difficult time fighting for possession of the puck and the Tornadoes took advantage. The Tornadoes quickly extended their lead with Steven Rosenquist(#5) scoring his second "Hat Trick" of the season with an assist by Rickey Campbell(#12). Great job, Steven!

Period 3 - The intense battle for the puck continued well into the 3rd period with the Tornadoes extending their lead with one more goal scored by Rickey Campbell(#12) with assist by Maxwell Mudge(#15). The Tornadoes used this opportunity to juggle their lines a bit and swap some Forwards for Defenseemen to have everyone gain some valuable experience playing positions other than their primary ones. Unfortunately, they let up their defense a bit and allowed the Phantoms to score 2 successive goals in an attempt to close the scoring gap. Undeterred, the Tornadoes collected themselves and got back to work. With only 20 seconds left on clock and just before the period closed, Jake Ferguson(#8) would score the final blow to the Phantoms with the assist by Luke Pizzey(#9). Great offensive shot, Jake!

Summary - In the end, the KVHA Tornadoes played a solid Tri-City team in tournament play on Saturday that resulted in a "W" for the Tornadoes with a final score of 7 to 2. KVHA Goalie Cameron Steinocher(#19) got "high fives" for his outstanding performance with two shut-out periods, while his team scored 7 goals over three periods on the competition.

Game 3 - KVHA Squirt Tornadoes (6) vs. Tri-Cities Squirt Bulls (0): While AC*DC was blaring over the intercom, the KVHA Tornadoes readied themselves to take on the TCAHA Bulls for their second game of the day Saturday, February 2nd at TRAC Ice Arena. With 2 games already under their belt, the Tornadoes were eager to get another "W"! That motivation was key as the Tornadoes churned it up and rallied with a relentless attack. So much so that the Tornadoes put an impressive 38 shots on the Bulls' net, forcing their goalie to work overtime to cover. Great teamwork, Tornadoes!

Period 1 - In hopes that being the home team would be an advantage, the Tornadoes took to the ice with a fierce competitiveness and intensity that was most welcome being so far away from home. At 11:38 of the first period, the Tornadoes struck first against the Tri-City Bulls with the early goal by Jake Ferguson(#8), assisted by Steven Rosenquist(#5). Kent Valley had 4 minor penalties for 8 minutes & 1 major penalty for 10 minutes.

Game 4 - KVHA Squirt Tornadoes (4) vs. PJH Inferno (1): The KVHA Tornado caravan rolled in shortly after dawn, amidst an extremely foggy morning, for their third and final day of the Desert Classic Tournament in Tri-Cities at the Toyota Ice Arena. Thankfully, the fog was only outside as the Tornadoes had clear sight for a win! Prepared for the 7:30 draw, the Tornadoes took full advantage of home ice once again and showed no mercy by outscoring the Inferno with an unrelenting assault to take the eventual win.

Period 1 - The heated battle for the puck began right as the whistle blew and the first puck was dropped. Only 3 minutes into the match,

Steven Rosenquist (#5) would score his first goal of the night, assisted by Rickey Campbell (#12). The back and forth positional zoning displayed by both teams was exhilarating to say the least – as if they were playing a game of “Keep Away”. Because of this, no other goals were scored for the rest of the period by either team and the Tornadoes would keep their lead going into the next period.

Period 2 - The 2nd period began the same way the 1st had ended – with a flurry of activity. The Tornadoes did an outstanding job fighting for possession of the puck and frustrating the Infernos as the period got into full swing. Consequently, the Tornadoes quickly extended their lead with Steven Rosenquist (#5) scoring one more unassisted goal to his roster – his second of the match. As if that weren’t enough, his impressive playmaking continued with just one minute left in the period, Steven Rosenquist (#5) completed his “Hat Trick” when he shot the puck past PJH Inferno goalie Cody Alexander for the his 3rd goal of the night! Assisted by Jake Ferguson (#8) and Luke Pizzey (#9). Outstanding effort, Steven!

Period 3 - As the final period opened, the Tornadoes kept their cool and wouldn’t let the Infernos’ fire get lit. Instead, they extended their lead by one more, on a magnificent goal by Luke Pizzey (#9), with Jake Ferguson (#8) and Steven Rosenquist (#5) assisting.

As in Game 2 of this tournament, the Tornadoes were again experimenting with some out-of-the-ordinary player/position swaps to test our boys in unfamiliar situations. With a 4-0 lead, the Tornadoes reluctantly let up a bit and allowed the Infernos to initiate a comeback and net a goal before the period closed. However, that would be the only spark detonated as the Tornadoes’ strong defensive skills held the Infernos to only that goal scored in the period. Great team work boys!

Summary - The KVHA Squirts Tornadoes did a great job to collect themselves throughout this match and were able to gather enough wind power to throw a few twisters at the Infernos - blowing most of the blaze out of the Infernos. The Tornadoes dominated the ice

scoring beating the Inferno 4 to 1, sealing their place in the Championship finals later in the day. As in Game 2 of this tournament, KVHA Goalie Cameron Steinocher(#19) once again got "high fives" for his exceptional performance with two shut-out periods, while his team scored 4 goals over three periods on the competition. Game 5 - KVHA Squirt Tornadoes (6) vs. PJH Black Knights (1): Five games in 2½ days kept the KVHA Squirts Tornadoes busy as they travelled across the Cascades to compete at the Tri-Cities' Desert Classic Tournament over the weekend. Not only did our boys play this many games in such a short timespan, but all games were 15 minute STOP time games - meaning we played more like the equivalent of SEVEN games in 2½ days! The close match-up between the two teams was evident as the Tornadoes faced-off for a rematch against the Portland Black Knights. Additionally, it should also be noted that most of the teams we played, especially the Portland Black Knights team in the finals, were a team of GIANTS no less, making our boys have to dig even deeper for that last ounce of energy. Whew! With the championship at stake, it was a great team effort by the Tornadoes in what would end as a momentous occasion on this whirl-wind weekend.

Period 1 - Some observers said it was an F-5 tornado that blew into the Tri-Cities, but it was just another day in the office for these Kent Valley ice warriors! The Squirts Tornadoes began as a mild breeze with Steven Rosenquist(#5) taking matters into his own hands and scoring an unassisted goal to start things off just over 30 seconds into the match. The passionate battle for the puck continued with strong defensive skills being put to the test. Unfortunately, Portland countered with a tying power play goal to end the period.

Period 2 - As the 2nd period opened, the Tornadoes wouldn't let a tie game distract them and quickly collected themselves when Maxwell Mudge(#15) scored a go-ahead goal, assisted by Tyler Sherwood(#2). The Black Knights had a difficult time fighting for possession of the puck and the Tornadoes took advantage as the period progressed. Just two minutes later, Steven Rosenquist(#5) scored his second goal of the night on an assist from Jake Ferguson(#8) to extended their lead and put the Tornadoes up two goals. Great team work boys!

Period 3 - As the final period opened, the Tornadoes took more than a second shot at the Black Knights. The Tornadoes' wind turned into an F-5 tornado at 12:31of the third period when Jake Ferguson(#8) scored a power play goal, assisted by Luke Pizzey(#9). Subsequently, a frenzy of activity followed with amazing play-making moves being stirred-up - only churning the frustrations of the Black Knights as they were assessed six penalties (1 major) in the period. Midway through the period and with an assist by Quinton Gessner (#10), Steven Rosenquist(#5) shot the puck past PJH Inferno goalie Sean McIntire and would score his 3rdgoal of the night to complete his "Hat Trick". Just call Steven, Mr. Hat Trick as he scored 3 of them during this tourney! Unbelievable task, Steven! Fortunately as

the period closed, the Tornados came out ahead in the puck battle and netted a final goal at 1:08 on the clock by Jake Ferguson(#8) with assist by Rickey Campbell(#12) & Maxwell Mudge(#15).

Summary - An unrelenting assault was the name of the game, causing the Tornados to dominate the ice scoring and take the eventual championship win by a final score of 6 to 1.
