Kent Valley Squirt Tornadoes Mauled by Grizzlies 6 to 3

Comcast Community Ice Center, Everett, WA 5 February, 2011 – In spite of a 6 to 3 loss over the weekend to the Everett Grizzlies, the Kent Valley Squirt Tornadoes maintained a solid lead on the rest of the NPSHL league with a 13-1-0 record and 40 points. Two NPSHL league games remain for the Tornadoes. They will face the Seattle Jr. Bulldogs (11th place) at home on February 12th and the SnoKing Green (7th place) at Castle Ice on February 26th. The Everett Grizzlies handed the Kent Valley Tornados their first loss in the NPSHL squirt division, 6-3, dropping the Tornado record to 13-1. Everett (12-1) used its home ice advantage well, jumping out to a two goal lead early in the first and winning the day with dominant puck possession and a mature attack in the Tornado zone. Danny Smith, Jake Sordahl, and Oliver Carlson scored for the Tornados. Brett Jenkins stopped 16 of 22 shots fired by the Grizzly offense but took the loss.

This was a match-up between two powerhouse offenses in the NPSHL Squirt division. The two teams came into the game with nearly similar records (13-0 for KV, 11-1 for EYH) and very similar stats (92 goals for and 12 goals against for KV and 95 goals for and 10 goals against for EYH). It promised to be one of the year's most challenging games for the Tornados.

Everett opened the scoring quickly, just :54 seconds into the game, on a nice rush from Easton Thomas –who broke into the zone with great speed and managed to cut across the front of the net with Tornado defenseman Ben McQuage hanging on him, finding the last 3 inches of open net beyond the outstretched leg pad of a sliding Jenkins. Christian Burgess notched the second goal for Everett just 2 minutes later with a well-placed wrist shot from just inside the slot going top-shelf on the glove side.

The Tornados settled down a bit and scoring leader Danny Smith countered with a nice rush and hard shot of his own just a minute later to stall the Grizzly attack and give the Tornados a shot of excitement. Jake Sordahl and Jack Hanscom combined to knot the score at 2 just as the horn sounded to end the 1st period.

The second period was action from start to finish – unfortunately for Kent Valley – most of it was in the Tornado zone. The Grizzlies mounted a very mature and intelligent attack backed by a tremendous hunger for the puck. Their attack in the offensive zone was the most advanced the Tornados have seen all year. Crisp passing between the defenseman on the blue lines, cycling down low from corner to slot, and a tenacious fore-check created many problems for the Tornado defense and created many close scoring chance. Jenkins played his best hockey in the second period, stopping several quality shots. However, the Grizzlies were able to notch 2 to end the period up 4-2.

The third period saw the Grizzlies go up 5-2 on another goal from Easton Thomas and then settle into a strong positional play to prevent any open breakaways from the Tornados. Kemper Terry led an attack into the zone before handing off to an open Oliver Carlson for the Tornados 3rd goal of the game. Everett responded with their final goal of the game just over a minute later.

The Tornados and the Tornado faithful were disappointed in the loss. However, the final score rarely tells the whole story, and one game does not a season make. Losses, in the hands of good coaches like the Tornado staff, can be tremendous tools as player's eyes and ears are inherently more open after a tough loss. And while hockey games are measured by goals, and goals created by passing and shooting – time and space are the player's workshop. Teams that create time and space – via skating, passing, and positioning – will find more opportunities to pass, shoot, and score. It's an abstract lesson for young players, but an important step in their development.

The Tornados next game (and chance to develop!) is this Saturday – February 12th – vs. the Seattle Jr. Bulldogs at 8:00 AM in the friendly confines of Kent Valley Ice Centre.

These two games fall into that category and the thought applies equally to both teams. Kent Valley just barely managed to tie the Tomahawks on Saturday and then dominated them on Sunday scoring two goals in each period and holding the Tomahawks scoreless. The Tomahawks held the Selects to two goals and scored two of their own on Saturday but couldn't get a goal of their own on Sunday and allowed the Selects to score 6 goals. Go figure!
