However, the Tornadoes weren't about to just hand it over and put up

a courageous fight, right up until the last seconds of the game! Unfortunately, it wasn't enough as they lost a rough one to the Sno-King Grey with a final score of 4 to 2.

Unfortunately, we were robbed of our opportunity to tie the game when the referee failed to award us a clear cut penalty shot opportunity as Steven Rosenquist (#5) was hauled down from behind while going in on a likely game-tying breakaway late in the second. Sadly, that glimmer of momentum wasn't enough to squelch the Greys as they were able to score once more to extend their lead before the period closed.

Period 3 - The electrifying battle continued well into the 3rd period as the Tornadoes countered an attack in an attempt to tie the game and perhaps steal the lead. However, the Greys would have 'none of it' and intensified their offensive barrage and defensive strategies to prevent any shift in momentum. Even though the Greys had 2 penalties in the game (occurring in the 2nd and 3rd periods, both for tripping), the Tornadoes were unable to take advantage of either of the power-play opportunity. Consequently, as the period went on, the turbulent struggle did not equate to any more scoring as no other goals were netted by either team due to the strong defensive skills shown by both goalies! Great performance & competitiveness displayed by both teams!

Summary - The exciting outcome of this game wasn't what the Kent Valley PeeWee Tornadoes had in mind when they started their day, as they lost a tough one to the SKAHA Jr. Tbirds Grey in league play Saturday. The Greys defeated the Tornadoes by a score of 4 to 2, capitalizing on an untimely Tornadoes penalty late in the 1st period and thanks in large part to a truly amazing performance with countless goal-robbing saves by the Greys' netminder throughout the game. The Greys fired 19 shots on the Tornadoes goal while the Tornadoes responded by putting an equally impressive 13 shots on the Greys' net. Tornadoes goalie Tyler Roberts (#35) stopped 15 of 19 Greys' shots - a respectable 79% save rate. After the game, KVHA Goalie Roberts got "high fives" for his outstanding performance over three periods on the competition. Excellent defense, Tyler!
