The rink dividers are utilized in KVHA's Learn to Play program, ADM practices and for cross ice games and other hockey training and development activities. Thanks PNAHA!

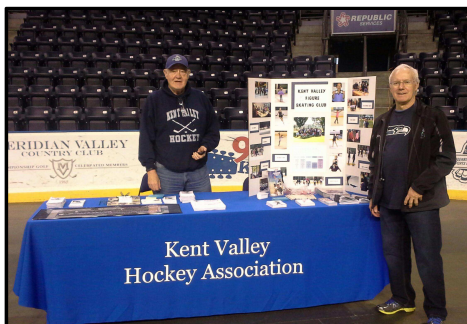
### **Kent Valley Announces 2015 Spring Hockey Programs**
