



## ***KVHA News – Everett Grizzlies Find a 3-Goal Miracle in Last 39 Seconds to Tie Kent Valley***

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. February 14, 2013** – Kent Valley’s PeeWee Hurricanes had the game well in hand Saturday at Everett’s Comcast Community Ice Rink with a 3-goal, 4 to 1, lead and less than a minute remaining to play in the game. It’s that point in a game, with a 4 to 1 lead like this, when the players on the winning team begin thinking about how they will celebrate the win when the final buzzer sounds less than a minute away. Players on the other team, with the final seconds ticking of the game clock, are thinking there is no way, short of a miracle, for this game to end in anything other than a loss. Therein lies the making of a miracle finish.

Everett’s Evan Bodenstab may have considered the possibility of a loss in that last minute of play Saturday, but he and his teammates chose not to give up or settle for a loss. Instead, Bodenstab got a break with just 39 seconds remaining in the game and scored a goal to cut the Kent Valley lead to 2 goals. The two teams faced off at center ice with just 39 seconds remaining. Everett won the faceoff and 12 seconds later Bodenstab found the back of the Kent Valley net to cut the Hurricanes’ lead to just one goal at 4 to 3. We’ll stop the game action here for a moment for some rhetoric about achieving the improbable.

Recently, January 19<sup>th</sup> to be exact, the Seattle Thunderbirds, lingering near the bottom of the WHL’s Western Conference with a terrible win/loss record and a 16 game losing streak, played the Portland Winterhawks who were solidly ensconced at the top of the Western Conference, sporting the best win/loss record in all of the WHL and in possession of a recent 14 game winning streak. The Thunderbirds defeated the Winterhawks 4 to 3 that night ending their 16 game losing streak against the strongest possible opponent in the WHL. Where does something like that come from? How does the team at the bottom of the pile rise up to perform so well that they surprise everyone, perhaps even themselves, and defeat the team at the top of the pile? It is a mystery to me.

Now, back to the Kent Valley PeeWee Hurricanes and Everett PeeWee Grizzlies where the score is 4 to 3 in favor of the Hurricanes. With only 27 seconds remaining on the clock Everett controlled the faceoff and charged toward the Kent Valley net where chaos ensued as the seconds ticked off the clock until Bodenstab ricocheted the puck off another player and into the Hurricanes’ net for the tying goal as the buzzer sounded to end the game. Bodenstab and his teammates achieved an improbable 4 to 4 tie and Bodenstab scored an amazing and incredible 38-second Hat Trick. I call that a miracle finish! Well done Evan...

There is some of kind of life lesson here but I’m not sure what it is. Maybe it is just simply never giving up. No matter what the odds are, and no matter how improbable the outcome might seem, never give up. Make it happen.

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. The fury of their relentless attacks lead the team to a thrilling victory of 8 to 0 – their seventh shutout for the NPSHL season!
