Last week, Stephenson met with state legislators in Olympia, who were very receptive. The University of Washington athletic department is now firing up a campaign. Obviously, D1 Ice Hockey in our area would be incredible for local hockey players and fans. Go Huskies!

We encourage KVHA members to visit the Facebook page of **“NCAA D1 Men's & Women's Ice Hockey at Washington”** and like it. The page is dedicated to finding support for bringing Division 1 Men’s & Women’s Ice Hockey to the University of Washington. The following comes from the Facebook page:

“The University of Washington has a rich athletic history and we believe that ice hockey would continue that great tradition, bring competitive hockey to the Pacific Northwest, and become a staple for winter activities in Seattle. With the recent shift in hockey programs there is currently room for about 5 new programs to join the D1 ranks on the west coast. Arizona State was the first Pac 12 team to announce a D1 program and we would like to see UW as the second.

The team would be able to recruit heavily from the local region and has a stadium ready for use in Key arena. We are currently forming a group that will present our case to the university and your support as a follower would help us strengthen our story.”

SnoKing Renton Castle Ice Arena, Renton, WA. February 15, 2015 – On Valentine's Day weekend, Coach Jeff Ferguson had his KVHA PeeWee Tornados team compete in their first tournament of the 2014-15 hockey season by hosting the inaugural "BATTLE OF THE VALLEY" at Kent Valley Ice Centre. And what a spectacular event it turned out to be – pitting 4 teams from 2 different states! With a bunch of thrills, chills and spills, it was hockey at its best! And boy did we

have fun! Amid our hosting duties, our boys managed to play and win ALL FOUR outstanding games showcasing the grit and game of this quick-paced sport, along with some spectacular sportsmanship skills!

Tournament Game 8 - Four games in 2½ days kept the KVHA PeeWee Tornadoes very busy as they competed in their first home tournament over the holiday weekend. In the final game, the Tornado boys fought hard and took advantage of the ice, showing no mercy by outscoring the Generals with an unrelenting assault. With the championship at stake, it was a great team effort by the Tornadoes in what would end as a momentous occasion on this whirl-wind weekend. Despite the slow start of the scoreless first period, the Tornadoes got things going by scoring first in the 2nd period from a sweet shot by Blake Hopkins, assisted by Zach Johnston & Austin Logue. Midway through the 3rd period, they would add one more on a goal from Maxwell Mudge, assisted by Jake Ferguson & Rickey Campbell. . Fortunately as the period closed, the Tornadoes came out ahead in the puck battle and would maintain their lead as the period closed. At the end of the day, the Tornadoes implemented the perfect defensive strategy, marked by high pressure fore-checking and dogged back-checking by every player, consistently pushing the Generals' offense out of good shooting lanes and limiting their shots to a small number of very low-percentage opportunities all game long. "Growing up I was in awe of Bobby Clarke. He was my guy. So to now have my name engraved on the same Cup as him? Are you kidding me? Amazing. Just amazing. Afterward I was completely physically and mentally drained, just spent. I remember going into the locker room and getting drenched in champagne. It was wonderful. To drink out of Stanley was so sweet. I even went up with Mike Keane and had a cigar up in the seats at the forum. We just sat back and reflected upon what we had just done. That was a moment I will never forget, just me and Keane smokin' a stogie, smiling together all alone in those hallowed grounds. Pretty cool stuff."
