Kent WA 22 February, 2009 – As most KVHA members know, you don't have to travel very far to gain an appreciation for what we have right here at home in Kent Valley Ice Centre. Case and point; I traveled to Beaverton, Oregon, with the Bantam Tier-II Selects on Saturday for an exhibition game at Valley Ice Arena. Valley Ice is known as "the rink with character, and characters," and it lived up to its name. I had forgotten that this rink even existed. My last visit was six years ago when our PeeWee Tornadoes played there. As I drove into the parking lot it all started to come back to me. I remembered that this is the rink with no lines or face-off circles on the ice; it is the rink with the slow moving miniature ice clearing vehicle (not to be confused with a Zamboni) and the cramped locker rooms.

The locker rooms are so small that four or five of our Kent Valley players had to dress in the main lobby. The lobby is so cramped that parents found it difficult to gather and mingle for pre-game and post-game chats without being bumped by others trying to squeeze by to enter or exit the facility. The glass around the rink is so marred by years of pucks, sticks and body parts bumping against them that it is difficult to see the game clearly through the glass. The scoreboard is mounted on the wall behind the bleachers where it's difficult to see unless you're on one of the team benches across the ice.

In spite of the lack of creature comforts at Valley Ice Arena the facility is a valuable asset for the community of Beaverton, Oregon. The rink has been in business for 45 years, is home to the River City Jaguars Jr. team, and is a host rink for the Portland Jr. Hawks Amateur Hockey Association and the Oregon High School Hockey League. The rink also hosts an adult/senior hockey league and is home to the Carousel Skating Club.

I often moan and groan about the minor imperfections of our home facility and it bugs the heck out of me that our pro shop is never open when you need it most, and often doesn't have what you need when it is open. But, you know what? After spending a few hours at Valley Ice Arena in Beaverton, Oregon, I can deal with the minor imperfections at Kent Valley Ice Centre, our home sweet home.

Johnston also complimented goalie Evan Turpin; "Evan played a great game on Sunday. He stopped everything they threw at him and earned a well-deserved shutout. He was awesome!"

Coach Johnston complimented the Officials for controlling the game and the turmoil after the game. Johnston said: "They prevented a bad situation from turning really ugly."

Congratulations to the Kent Valley Midget Tier-II Selects and their coaches, not so much for the victory on Sunday, which is sweet, but more importantly for their responsible and mature conduct in the face of adversity. You've earned our respect and made us very proud. Well done!
