



## ***Perfection Eludes Kent Valley's Joshua Severeid, Again...***

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. February 29, 2012** – Joshua Severeid, goaltender for the Kent Valley Midget Tornadoes fell victim to another last minute goal against as he watched a potential shutout fade away in the closing minutes of the game. Everett's Brendan Smith slipped the puck past Severeid with just 1:59 remaining to play Saturday. It was Everett's only goal of the game. Severeid had 16 saves up until Smith faced him down in the last two minutes of the game. Even with that last minute goal against, Severeid finished the game with an impressive 94% save rate. And, his team skated away with an equally impressive 8 to 1 NPSHL League win.

Severeid is no stranger to shutouts. He has at least three shutouts this season; 4 to 0 October 8<sup>th</sup> against the Everett Bruins, 5 to 0 November 5<sup>th</sup> against the Tacoma Jr. Tomahawks and 9 to 0 December 28<sup>th</sup> against the Everett Kodiaks. However, Severeid has come within 2 minutes or less of earning a shutout in a number of other games this season; maybe two or three games. It would be interesting to go back through the season's worth of score sheets and count how many times last minute goals have ruined shutouts for this outstanding and deserving goalie. I know he came within 1:04 of a shutout on February 12<sup>th</sup> as his Tornadoes defeated the Seattle Jr. Eagles 4 to 1.

Does Severeid nod off as the last few seconds are clicking off the clock? Does he celebrate too early and leave the net empty? Does his defense head for the locker room before the game has ended? Does a player on the bench mention the forbidden "S" word (shutout) and jinx him? Or, maybe its Joshua's empathy for the losing team; he feels badly for them... Who knows? It's very puzzling.

Joshua; you are one of the unluckiest goalies I've ever met. But, you rank up there among the best I've ever seen. You are seconds away from perfection young man! Keep trying!

February 25, 2012** – Kent Valley's Bantam Tornadoes played their final NPSHL regular season game on Saturday and wrapped up the season in good form as they blanked the Puget Sound Tomahawks 3 to 0. The Tornadoes finished the season with a 10-5-1 record, went 7-2-1 in the last 10 games, and registered 34 team points to secure 4<sup>th</sup> place in the NPSHL Bantam Division. It was a tight race to the finish as only 6 points separated the top 4 teams.

Tornadoes Coach Jeff Alonzo stressed the importance of sportsmanship points as part of the formulae for division ranking. Alonzo said; *"The Tornadoes were awarded 13 out of a possible 16 sportsmanship points during the season. Those 3 points would have moved the Tornadoes up to 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the Bantam Division."*

The Tornadoes averaged 3.06 goals per game during league play (3<sup>rd</sup> overall), while allowing 2.25 goals against per game (4<sup>th</sup> overall.) That's a strong goals-against average considering the Tornadoes split playing time every game using two different goalies.

The Tornadoes move on to the play-offs playing the #5 seed SnoKing Grey in the first round. Kent went 2-0 against Grey in the regular season.
