## **Spring Program Enrollments Growing Fast – Sign up Now!**

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA 3 March, 2011** – Spring Learn to Play, “3 on 3” Cross Ice (99’s and younger) and Spring Hockey Practice are all experiencing high enrollments according to KVHA Registrar, Rena Sullivan. Enrollment forms can be found on the front page of the KVHA web and also under the **Spring Programs** tab. KVHA’s Hockey Director, Danny Lorenz, indicated Wednesday that a Thursday “3 on 3” Cross Ice could be added to the program if enrollment continues to grow.

KVHA’s Les Grauer said this about “3 on 3” Cross Ice: *“It is the primary intent of this program to provide an opportunity for the kids to organize & manage themselves in a more relaxed, game-like setting than in a typical team atmosphere. Win or lose, the onus is on the players to simply play. In short, outside of providing a referee (i.e. adult-supervision), ice-time, and an opponent, there will be zero coaching provided.”*

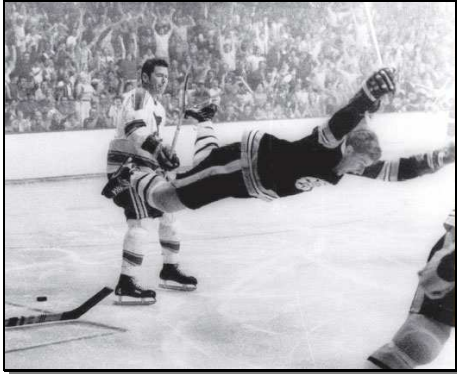
