



KVHA News – Love it or Hate it, Here Comes Daylight Saving Time – Spring Forward Sunday!

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. Friday, March 11, 2016 – Don't forget to "Spring Forward" this coming Sunday at 2:00am. Daylight Saving time begins Sunday March 13th.

Here's a little known fact about the origin of Daylight Saving Time. Canada initiated the practice of moving clocks forward one hour in the spring of each year beginning in 1918. This was done for the purpose of providing an additional hour of daylight for playing and practicing the sport of ice hockey. The need for an extra hour of daylight for ice hockey came as a result of the humiliating defeat of the Montreal Canadiens by the Seattle Metropolitans for the coveted Stanley Cup on March 26th, 1917 in Seattle. On March 27th, 1917, the Montreal Canadiens' Head Coach George Kennedy petitioned the Canadian Parliament, Prime Minister and Governor General to institute Daylight Saving to save hockey in Canada. The petition was honored 5 days later with overwhelming approval by Parliament. And that is how Daylight Saving Time began.
