Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. March 6, 2014 – In a press release Wednesday March 5th, 2014, North Puget Sound Hockey League (NPSHL) Commissioner Bill Guerrero announced Emma Wallace of the KVHA Squirt Tornados as the winner of the first annual NPSHL/WHL Most Sportsmanlike Player of the Year for 2014. Wallace was nominated for the honor by her Squirt Tornados' Coach, Derek Pizzey. The annual award for a player in each age division of the NPSHL League is sponsored by the NPSHL and the WHL Seattle Thunderbirds and Everett Silvertips.

"Emma is such a positive team player for our team. She is always working hard for the team. She gives 100% during games and practices. Her team-first attitude is evident in the way she has stepped up and played Defense for games when we were shorthanded at that position. On two other occasions, she stepped between the pipes and played Goalie for games this season. She plays well with every player on our team. She ALWAYS has a smile on her face when she is on the ice. She is very coachable and listens and implements the coaching that we provide her," Pizzey said of Wallace.

Coach Pizzey also praised Emma for her total and complete love of hockey. *"Even when she is not involved with her squirt team, hockey is a prevailing factor in her life. She frequently volunteers to help at the Mite practices on her off nights. In her down time away from the rink, she plays hockey in the garage with her brother or knee hockey in the house! Her love of Hockey (and the things she learns from the coaches) has even carried over into her school work. She often writes about her time on the ice for writing assignments. At School and at home she has often been heard repeating key phrases she learns from us coaches like 'You play your games like how you practice'."*

Another Record for KVHA Midget Select Tyler Jennings

Editors Note: Over my years at Kent Valley Ice Centre I've had numerous players from Mites through Midgets stand in front of my desk and ask if I had an extra set of knee pads, shoulder pads, a spare hockey stick, a helmet, or even a pair of skates, because they had forgotten to pack all their gear before they headed off to the ice rink. However, I've never had a player come in and say they had forgotten ALL of their hockey gear... That is, until two weeks ago when Tyler Jennings of the Kent Valley Midget Tier-II Selects came into the office and told Coach Danny Lorenz that he couldn't practice that afternoon because he had forgotten to bring his hockey gear with him; all of his hockey gear, the entire bag and sticks. Between Coach Lorenz and other Midget Selects' players they were able to scrounge up enough spare parts for Jennings to participate in that afternoon's practice.

Now, to Tyler's credit, there is an explanation of how this happened. The Midget Selects have their own full-time locker room at Kent Valley Ice Centre where they keep their hockey gear between practices. So, it is not unusual for players to just hop in their cars and drive off to the rink for practice without their hockey bag. Tyler and his team had just returned from a tournament in Las Vegas and this particular practice was their first after returning home. Tyler simply forgot that his hockey gear wasn't in the locker room...

Here's the record part; as near as any of us can recall, Tyler is the first Kent Valley hockey player to ever show up for practice without one single piece of his hockey gear. That's uh, well; a record of sorts. Congratulations Tyler!

For the record, back on January 18th and 19th, Tyler Jennings established a new KVHA record of 10 assists for **MOST ASSISTS IN TWO CONSECUTIVE GAMES**. Jennings is also

tied at 5 assists with Alex Bolshakov and Jesse Howland for **MOST ASSISTS IN ONE GAME.**

Kent Valley Squirt Tornadoes Defeat SnoKing Squirt Grey 6 to 1 in NPSHL Playoffs

Castle Ice Arena, Renton, WA. March 2, 2014 – It was a fine day at Castle Ice Arena in Renton Sunday as the Kent Valley's Squirt Tornadoes took on SnoKing Squirt Grey in the first round of the NPSHL Playoffs. The Tornadoes defeated Grey 6 to 1 and will move on to round two of the playoffs in Bremerton March 8th.

Kent Valley's Connor Kirby led off the scoring in the opening minute of the second period with an unassisted goal. Caleb Chaloner put the Tornadoes up by two goals with his unassisted goal eight minutes later. SnoKing scored their only goal of the game with 5:20 remaining in the second period to cut the Tornadoes lead to one goal. G'bari Mayers scored an unassisted goal in the closing minute of the second period to regain a two-goal lead for the Tornadoes.

Caleb Chaloner took advantage of a power play opportunity to score the Tornadoes' fourth goal and Caleb's second goal of the game. Ema Wallace teamed up with G'bari Mayers to score the Tornadoes fifth goal of the game with 5:04 remaining to play. G'bari Mayers bumped the Tornadoes' lead to five goals with his unassisted power play goal with just 1:05 remaining in the game. The Tornadoes defense held on to take their 6 to 1 lead to the final buzzer and an exciting NPSHL League playoff victory.

Kent Valley's Savannah Dunn played an excellent game as she stopped 9 of 10 shots on goal for an impressive save rate of 90%. The Tornadoes outshot SnoKing 14 to 10. Way to go Tornadoes!
