## ***Kent Valley Squirt Tornados Fall to West Sound Warriors 3 to 5 in NPSHL Playoffs – What a Great Season!!!***

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. March 2, 2013** – On Saturday, March 2nd, the KVHA Squirt Tornados hosted the first Playoff game for the NPSHL season where they ranked second and faced off against the seventh ranked WSHC Warriors Black in a rematch battle on the ice. The two previous games by the Tornados were more lopsided affairs as their opponent failed to get momentum and allowed them to score several goals in each of the two games. However, Saturday was a different story. In a very competitive match-up, the Tornados' magical season came to a tragic end as they lost a rough one to the Blacks, knocking them out of the playoffs.

**Period 1** - As the first puck dropped, the anticipation of the first Squirt Playoff game and another intense hockey battle was in the air! Even after the first face-off, the fierce competitiveness displayed by both teams was clearly at the forefront of play. The Tornados struck first against the Blacks with the early goal at 8:40 of the first period by Jake Ferguson(#8), assisted by Luke Pizzey(#9) and Steven Rosenquist(#5). But it wasn't enough to hold off the attack by the Blacks as they tied it up with a goal to get on the scoreboard as the period closed.

**Period 2** - The electrifying battle continued well into the 2nd period as the Tornados mounted an attack. Steven Rosenquist(#5) led the charge with a goal, assisted by Nico Rogers(#1). Unfortunately, the Tornados let down their guard a bit and in a bizarre déjà vu moment, allowed the Blacks to score 2 successive goals only 20 seconds apart (and by the same 2 players). Sadly, this would allow the Blacks to gain the upper hand and take the lead. As the Tornados fought hard throughout the period, it appeared as if this was a totally different team than we previously played. Regrettably, the Blacks retained the upper hand and kept the lead with a score of 3 to 2, preventing the Tornados from scoring again as the period closed.

**Period 3** - As the 3rd period opened, the Blacks netted 1 more goal, only seconds after the period began, making the score 4 to 2. Undeterred, the Tornados got back to work, attempting to shift the momentum their way. Unfortunately, the Blacks had other ideas and scored again, stretching their lead even farther. With a 3-goal deficit and nearing the closing minutes of the period, Maxwell Mudge(#15) initiated a comeback with a goal, assisted by Michael Geddes(#7). The struggle continued and despite many great opportunities and near

misses, the Tornadoes simply ran out of time to regain the lead. In fact, the score was tied two times during the game! Even though the Blacks had most of the penalties of the game, the Tornadoes were sadly unable to take advantage of any of the power-play opportunities to complete the comeback.

**Summary** - Ultimately, the Kent Valley Squirt Tornadoes suffered an unexpected and extremely disheartening loss in playoff league play Saturday against the WSHC Warriors Black. The Blacks defeated the Tornadoes by a final score of 5 to 3. The Blacks fired 27 shots on the Tornadoes goal while the Tornadoes put an equally impressive 19 shots on the Blacks' net. Tornadoes goalie Cameron Steinocher (#19) stopped 22 of 27 Blacks' shots for an 81% save rate. In the end, hockey will remain the world's greatest and most exciting game to each of our young ice warriors – despite this monumental loss. Next up, the Tornadoes play in the SJHA Fred Chomos Memorial Tournament in Lynnwood on March 22nd -24th. Good luck, Tornadoes!

On a side note, the irony in all of it is that later that evening, the Seattle T-birds would lose by the exact same score! Ugh!
