Penalties Handicap Kent Valley Midget Tornadoes at Midget "B" Tournament

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA 20 March, 2011 – Penalties got in the way of Chuck Cadiente's Tornadoes in the PNAHA Midget "B" tournament at Kingsgate over the weekend. The Tornadoes won their first game in a shootout by a score of 3 to 2, this in spite of being called for 12 penalties for 51 minutes. The Seattle Jr. Midget "B" NW Admirals edged out the Tornadoes in game two by a score of 3 to 2. The Tornadoes avoided the penalty box in game two limiting their penalties to 8 minors for 16 minutes. The Tornadoes penalty affliction returned in game 3 against the Kitsap County Midget "B" Outlaws as the Outlaws defeated them 4 to 2 and the frustrated Tornadoes were called for 18 penalties for a total of 90 minutes. The Kitsap Outlaws escaped the whistle plague with 3 penalties for a total of 17 minutes.

In summary, the Tornadoes scored 7 goals while their opponents scored 9 against them. In three games the Tornadoes were called for 38 penalties for 167 minutes while their opponents were called for 17 penalties for 56 minutes. Shots on goal for the tournament were 81 by the Tornadoes and 83 by their opponents. One might argue that less time in the penalty box might have resulted in more scoring opportunities and a couple more wins. The Tornadoes are certainly capable of winning at this level.

Midget U18 Tier-II Selects Win PNAHA Title and Trip to Nationals in Ohio

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA 15 March, 2011 – Kent Valley's Midget Selects stumbled on Spokane in game two of the PNAHA Playoffs but defeated them in the playoff final to win the PNAHA Midget Tier-II title. Mikey Anderson scored the winning goal in the final game with just 0:12:07 seconds remaining to play. The goal stunned the Spokane Jr. Chiefs and brought jubilation to Kent Valley fans in the bleachers and players on the ice. After the final 0:12:07 seconds ticked off the clock everyone celebrated again. Coach Danny Lorenz remarked later; *"You should have seen the look on the faces of our players, the look in their eyes. It was like, we did it! Oh my God, we did it! I'll never forget that!"*

The five games of the PNAHA Playoffs were good for the Selects' two outstanding goalies. Troy Turpin earned two shutouts in games 1 and 3, bringing his season total to 8, and Dmitri Nikitin earned a shutout in game 4 to bring his season total to 6. Damon Hanson had a terrific outing in game four scoring 3 goals and 2 assists for 5 points. Hanson had a total of 9 points for the tournament.
