

KVHA News - What the HECC? Hockey Helmets Have an Expiration Date...

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. July 7, 2013 – KVHA members are advised to check out their hockey player's hockey helmet and make sure it has a HECC Certification sticker with an unexpired date. If not, the helmet needs to be replaced. Hockey helmets are generally certified for a life of about 6½ years. Most youth hockey players outgrow a helmet before its expiration date. Expired helmets should be replaced with a HECC certified helmet. Make sure the new helmet has the HECC certification sticker with an expiration date that is at least 5 years out.



KVHA coaches will be checking all players at the beginning of the 2013/2014 hockey season to make sure all helmets are in compliance. Officials will also be checking at game-time to make sure everyone is in compliance and prepared for safe play.
