



KVHA News - Bolshakov's Five Assists Establish New KVHA Scoring Record

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. September 19, 2013 – It was a great game Sunday for the Kent Valley PeeWee Tier-II Selects. Danny Smith scored a Hat Trick, Derek Smith scored a Hat Trick (his first ever) plus one (4 goals total) and Nolan Meekhof kept his consecutive game scoring streak alive with 2 goals. However, the star of the game and the most valuable player has to be Alex Bolshakov. Bolshakov had 1 assist in the first period, 2 assists in the second period and 2 assists in the third period for a total of five assists in one game; a new KVHA Record. He also scored a goal in the third period for a total of 6 points in the game. Congratulations Alex! Your record has been posted to the KVHA Record Book.

The old assist record of 4 assists in one game was shared between three players; Luke Blair (11/20/2010), Anthony Petruzzelli (11/08/2008) and Tyler Sybil (09/28/2008) each scored 4 assists in one game. Bolshakov's six points in one game falls short of the KVHA record of nine points in one game currently held by Luke Blair. On November 20, 2010, Blair had 5 goals and 4 assists in one game as his Kent Valley Bantam Tornadoes defeated the Everett Bantam Kodiaks 13 to 0. Blair scored 2 goals in the first period, 1 goal in the second and 2 goals in the third period, and added 4 assists in the third period for a total of 9 points in the game.

Schedule Changes Still in the Works

Schedule changes continue with our daily ice schedules. Our two Squirt Rec teams had to be combined into one team and some of the Mite members of the Squirt teams moved back to Mites. According to Les Grauer, KVHA's Executive Director, USA Hockey's ADM regulations allow the move up of only three players from Mites to Squirts. KVHA had 8 Mites playing at the Squirt level.

Members are urged to check the ice schedules frequently this time of year. We're getting closer each week to a firm practice schedule. However, it doesn't hurt to check the Ice Schedule tab on the KVHA Web before you head off the ice rink.

Lorenz Will Offer Goalie Clinics Beginning in October

KVHA's Hockey Director, Danny Lorenz, will offer a Goalie Clinic during the Friday evening Stick n' Puck sessions beginning in October. Lorenz was unable to confirm a specific starting date as he is waiting for his Midget Tier-II team's league schedule to be confirmed. Lorenz will offer the clinic based upon his availability. Goalies interested in the clinics should contact Danny for more details.

Lorenz knows more than a little about being a goalie. He played five seasons for the Western Hockey League Seattle Thunderbirds from 1985-1986 through the 1989-1990 seasons. He was drafted by the New York Islanders (fourth New York pick, 58th overall) in the 1988 NHL Entry Draft. Lorenz, originally from Murrayville, British Columbia, played 225 games for Seattle in the Western Hockey League. His professional career spanned fourteen seasons, 1990-1991 through 2003-2004, and included over 600 games. He played 136 games in the American Hockey League (AHL), 46 games in the British Ice Hockey Superleague (BISL), 28 games in the British National League (BNL), 22 games in the German Deutschland Elite League (DEL), 32 games in the Central Hockey League (CHL), 53 games in the East Coast Hockey League (ECHL), 236 games in the International Hockey League (IHL), 56 games with the Tacoma Sabercats in the West Coast Hockey League (WCHL) and 8 games in the National Hockey league (NHL). Lorenz still holds several Seattle Thunderbird and Western Hockey League Goaltending records.

PeeWee Tier-II Selects Fall to SnoKing and Dominate Seattle Jr. in Weekend Exhibition Play

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. September 14 & 15, 2013 – Kent Valley's PeeWee Tier-II Selects lost their Friday evening game against SnoKing 6 to 2 but turned things around Saturday afternoon and dominated Seattle Jr. 13 to 4. SnoKing's JT Rimorin (former Kent Valley player 2006-2009) scored a Hat Trick against the Selects in Friday's game. Danny Smith cut SnoKing's 3 goal lead to 2 goals in the second period with an assist from Derek Smith. Kent Valley's Nolan Meekhof scored his second goal in as many games. Meekhof's power play goal late in the third period was assisted by Trevor Mertel. Friday's game was played at Castle Ice Arena in Renton.

Saturday's game with Seattle Jr. was scoreless until 8:07 of the first period when Adam Beamish took advantage of a power play opportunity to score the Selects' first goal of the game with an assist from Alex Bolshakov. Just 27 seconds later Gregory Shanygin scored with an assist from Lexi Doner Jr. Seattle Jr. scored near the end of the period to make it 2 to 1 in favor of Kent Valley.

Danny Smith scored two goals in the second period, one was a power play, with assists from Alex Bolshakov and Lexi Doner Jr. Nolan Meekhof tallied two goals in the second period, both were power plays, with assists from Danny McCarragher and Trevor Mertel. Derek Smith scored his first goal of the game during the second period with an assist from Bolshakov. Seattle Jr. scored twice to end the period with Kent Valley on top by a score of 7 to 3.

The final period belonged to the Selects as they outscored Seattle Jr. 6 to 1. Derek Smith completed his first ever Hat Trick by scoring the first two goals of the period. Adam Beamish assisted his first goal and Alex Bolshakov assisted the second. Danny Smith completed his Hat Trick by scoring a power play goal at 6:20 with an assist from Bolshakov. At 10:10 Alex Bolshakov converted from being a play maker into a scorer. He scored unassisted on a power play. Derek Smith padded his Hat Trick by scoring his fourth goal of the game at 12:24. Smith's goal was assisted by Caedmon Kim. Mark Hanscom scored the final goal of the game at 13:38 with an assist from Logan Seals. Final score: Seattle Jr. 4 and Kent Valley 13.

Kent Valley scored on 8 of 11 power play opportunities for a conversion rate of 73%. Seattle Jr. scored on 1 of 2 power play opportunities for a conversion rate of 50%. Kent Valley outshot Seattle Jr. 30 to 25.
