Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. September 29, 2013 – Kent Valley’s Midget Tornadoes took a 2 to 0 first period lead all the way to near the end of the third period Sunday. Each team scored a goal in the final period to end the game with a 3 to 1 score in favor of the Tornadoes.

Kent Valley outshot the Tomahawks 14 to 1 in the first period and 23 to 15 for the game. Kent Valley was 0 for 2 on the power play while Tacoma went 1 for 6. Young Ben Cary played well between the pipes for the Tornadoes. It took a Tomahawk man-advantage Power Play to finally beat Cary with just 5:06 remaining to play. Cary ended the game with an impressive 93.3% save rate.

Patrick Dunphy got the Tornadoes on the board with his unassisted goal midway through the first period. Jacob Ray scored the first of his two goals with 1:19 remaining in the first period. Ray was assisted by Jordan Wachter. Ray scored his second goal with 7:19 remaining to play in the third period. Ray was assisted by Jeremy Blondin. Ray gets credit for the game-winning goal.
