Score Sheet and Score Keeping Instructions Available

Sloppy and incomplete score sheets are a big problem for those who have to read and interpret them; registrars, team officials, hockey officials, league officials and last but not least, newsletter editors. It is difficult to criticize a volunteer, and all of our score keepers are valued volunteers. However, we have the capacity to make our volunteer effort even better. A set of **Scorekeeper Forms and Samples** are available on the KVHA web. [**Click here**](#) to view the samples. In the mean time, we would appreciate your help with the following:

- **Game Information** - Please make sure you fully complete the information at the top of the score sheet including the location of the game and curfew time (am/pm). All of that information is important...
- **Rosters** – If you use labels, please make sure there is a label on each page of the score sheet. Also, make sure any updates on the top label are also entered on each of the other labels. CEP numbers must be supplied by the coaches. If it isn't entered, have the referee take the score sheet to the bench and request the coaches enter their CEP numbers.
- **Shots and Saves** – Please make sure you have someone counting shots on goal and assure that they get entered onto the score sheet. Also, please make sure you enter the goalie number under GOALIE next to shots and saves.
- **Power Plays and Shorthanded Goals** – Please indicate PP for power play and SHG for shorthanded goal.
- **Penalties** – Please be legible. Use a black fine point pen and write legibly. Make sure you indicate OFF time and ON time for penalties. Entries in the START time box should only be made when the START time is different from the OFF time (like with multiple penalties to a single player or a delayed penalty).

Doner Hat Trick Highlights PeeWee Tier-II Selects' 7 to 2 win Over Puget Sound Tier-II Tomahawks

Puget Sound Hockey Center, Tacoma, WA 2 October, 2010 – The Kent Valley Selects' Ian Doner didn't waste any time Saturday earning his first Hat Trick of the season. Doner scored 3 goals over a span of 3 minutes and 26 seconds. Earlier in the game, Doner assisted Nick Van Halder's goal, the Selects second goal of the game, for a total of 4 points on the morning. Andrew Bell took a pass from Dylan Moriarty and tapped in the Selects first goal of the game. A little over a minute later Nick Van Halder scored with the assist from Doner. JJ Blondin continued his play-making moves with a tipped puck to Nicky Pokrzywinski who scored the Selects third goal, a power play goal. Then it was off to the races and Ian Doner's Hat Trick with goals at 1:20 and 0:56 remaining in the first period and the "hatter" with 12:54 remaining in the second period. Dawson Myers scored an unassisted goal at 10:24 to cap the Select's scoring at seven goals. The Selects were 3 for 10, 30%, on the power play while Puget Sound went 1 for 5 for 20%.

Puget Sound struggled throughout the game with excessive penalties. The Tomahawks first goal was scored with 5:32 remaining in the second with an assist from Nauman. Finneseth scored the Tomahawks second goal and final goal of the game, an unassisted power play goal, with 11:54 remaining to play in the game.
