



## ***KVHA News – NPSHL League Play Gets Underway as PNAHA Tiering Winds Down***

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. October 10, 2013** – North Puget Sound Hockey League (NPSHL) play got underway this past weekend with lots of exciting action. Elsewhere, the Pacific Northwest Amateur Hockey Association (PNAHA) annual tiering competition came to a close; unless some playoffs are needed. Kent Valley teams outscored their opponents 54 to 25 in eleven weekend games with 6 wins, 1 tie and 4 losses. Below are some comments regarding some noteworthy individual and team performances from this past weekend.

**Squirt Tornadoes** - Caleb Chaloner had two goals and an assist and was headed down the ice and with a good chance to notch the Hat Trick.
