REMINDERS!!

- Parents of our red group players- please keep being alert and making yourself available- but please don't enter the penalty box and open the doors. This is distracting to our players and coaches. We'll bring your player to you if the need arises.
- Please bring USA Hockey Registration numbers or call Rena for those who have not provided them.
- Check equipment bags before leaving home so we have all our gear when we arrive at the rink.
- Let me know of any rental equipment issues. We can do exchanges. Just not 5 minutes before going on ice :)
- Smaller jerseys are on order. I will let you know when we get them for the players who need one. Should be shortly!
- Bring a water bottle with name bar attached to it so your player can drink water on-ice when thirsty.
- Skates should be sharpened once every couple months.
- Stick should be no longer than players nose when player is on skates.
- Stick should have tape (cloth tape) on the handle at the end to help player hold on to it, and blade to help protect and control the puck. Tape is available for sale in the KVIC Pro Shop.
- Helpful hint to keep up socks is to use sock tape and wrap around shin pads.
- Please have your player use the potty before getting dressed.

Bremerton Ice Arena, Bremerton, WA 9 October, 2010 – The Kent Valley Mites won their game 15-3 on Sunday in Bremerton. Unfortunately, the score sheet is such a total mess; they might as well have not kept one. So, rather than try to create a game report from the unreadable and incorrect score sheet we'll give you the report from the visiting team's perspective.

The Kent Valley Tornadoes played well from the start scoring their first goal of the game in the opening minute of the first period. The Tornadoes added four more goals in the first period to end the period with a 5 to 0 lead. The Tornadoes fired 14 shots on goal in the first period with Kitsap getting 2 shots on the Tornadoes goaltender Chase Pagan.

The Outlaws scored the first goal of the second period, their only shot on goal during that period. The Tornadoes added 3 more goals to make it 8 to 1 at the end of the second. Squirt Tornadoes Win League Opener

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA 9 October, 2010 – The Kent Valley Squirt Tornadoes opened the 2010-2011 NPSHL season with an impressive victory over the visiting PCMH Spitfires, 9-0. It was a story of "twos" on the score sheet as four players netted two, and two players earned two assists. Danny Smith led all scorers with, of course, 2 goals and 2 assists.

While a young team in terms of experience, the Tornadoes' "first year ever players" showed veteran savvy and grit as Dylan Herzog, Jack Hanscom, Joey Geisendorfer, and Nate Dunn all earned their first points in organized hockey – with Dylan, Jack and Joey adding another point for a pair in their first game. And while the Tornadoes play was a bit messy – first game jitters and early season slips – the team showed great energy and several new players demonstrated they have a true "nose" for the puck!

The game started slowly as both teams cautiously probed and struggled to both win and hold possession, but at the seven minute mark Dylan Herzog scored a second effort goal which saw his entire line contribute to the score sheet and put the Tornadoes ahead to stay. Danny Smith, coming off an impressive Mite campaign last year, netted his first of the year at 11:35. And with time running out in the first Blake Britten found the net – with helpers from Dunn and Jesper Miquel – to give the Tornadoes a solid 3-0 lead at the first intermission.

If there was any doubt about the outcome of this, the Tornadoes erased it with two goals in the first minute of the second period with Danny scoring his second, and Ben McQuage scoring at the 1:10 mark. Ben, a silky smooth skating defenseman, scored another as the period ended for a 2 marker game. But the sweetest goal of the period came at the 7:40

mark with a beautiful set-up from Joey G. to Jack Hanscom who pounded home the shot past a sprawling Spitfire goaltender.

The third period saw Jack Hanscom net his second of the game to finish the scoring on an assist from Oliver Carlson.

The Spitfires played hard and clean and credit should be given to Spitfire goaltender Isaiah Barber who faced 21 shots and made some very good saves. Brett Jenkins back-stopped the Tornadoes, stopping all 5 shots he faced to earn his first shutout of the year. The Tornadoes travel to Lynnwood next Sunday, October 17th to take on the Seattle Jr. Badgers.
