

Skill Development & Conditioning Programs Pay Dividends for KVHA Teams

Kent WA 13 October, 2008 – It has become more and more apparent as I watched games over the past couple of weekends that the Kent Valley Hockey Association's (KVHA) focus on a variety of skill development and conditioning activities over the past couple years is paying dividends. Take the Mites. Our KVHA Mite teams include a balanced mixture of veterans and new players; promotions from the Learn-to-Play (LTP) program. We're already seeing the players from LTP make a positive impact on their teams. The LTP promotion players are getting their share of shots on goal, making passes, catching passes, carrying the puck and playing their positions, right along with the veterans. I was impressed with how well our two Mite teams played last weekend in the Mite "Battle of the Valley." I credit our successful LTP program for providing a strong foundation for these new players and preparing them well for playing at the Mite level, and at the Squirt level in some cases.

I observed our PeeWee Tier-II Selects in several games over the past few weeks. In a game at Castle Ice this past Friday night I was impressed with the Selects as they cycled the puck in the Sno-King zone controlling the puck for minutes on end. By my calculation the Selects played 80% of the game in the Sno-King end of the ice, controlling the puck, taking in excess of 50 shots on goal and controlling the pace of the game. The Selects were always first to the puck and rarely abandoned the battle for it in the corners. It seemed to me like they never tired of digging for the puck, looking for the open teammate or rushing the net for a shot. I believe the PeeWee Tier-II success can be attributed to the involvement of many of these players in one or more of several KVHA programs; Spring Hockey, 3-on-3 King's Court competition, Les Grauer's summer Individual Hockey Skills and Accelerated Training programs, and conditioning activities at Kent PT & Sports Performance.
