Puget Sound Hockey Center, Tacoma, WA. October 13, 2013 – Coach Jeff Ferguson took his KVHA Tornadoes team to Puget Sound Hockey Center on Sunday for their second league game of the season to face-off against the Tacoma Rockets. In another electrifying contest, the Tornadoes took to the ice with their solid performance and impressive teamwork amidst the cool, crisp nature of the old meat-locker arena. It was the kind of game where you hated to see either team lose; it was the kind of contest where it looked like it could easily end in a friendly handshake and everyone could go home with a 'well-we-didn't-lose' smile on their face. And that's just how it ended.....in an electrifying tie match right up until the last buzzer sounded.

Period 1 - As the period began and the tensions built, both teams fought hard for possession of that elusive puck as they went toe-to-toe in the 1st period. Our Tornadoes seemed a bit off their game positionally and we're missing a step off their usual speed - possibly due to the frigid temperature of the meat-locker, or possibly due to overconfidence, but definitely out of synch. Unfortunately, their game was let down a bit when the Rockets scored the first goal of the match just before the first period came to a close. Thankfully, the impressive team effort displayed by the Tornadoes where some timely defensive plays by D and forwards alike helped them escape that period only down a goal.

Period 2 - The Tornadoes would not let the scoreboard distract them and quickly got back to work as the turbulent battle for possession continued well into the 2nd period. Both teams fought hard to gain control of the puck and take the upper hand. The Tornadoes did a terrific job on defense as well as offensive plays but couldn't translate this extraordinary effort into any pucks in the net (despite several close calls during the period). It appeared that the Tornadoes started to turn the corner a bit and showed some signs of coming out of hibernation.... possibly a tornado developing? Even though the Tornadoes still struggled to settle into their team positional play, some notable individual defensive plays churned, along with their goalie showing more comfort between the pipes and coming up with some very timely key saves, held Tacoma to a single goal once again! Unfortunately, this would give the Rockets a 2-goal lead in the waning minutes of regulation. Not a safe enough distance from a tornado!

Period 3 - The final period opened in a much different way than both previous periods had played. It appeared that the Tornadoes found the other gear they had been missing in periods 1 & 2 and finally started to take it to Tacoma! Turning it up a notch, the KVHA Tornadoes' relentless offensive attack, coupled with their strong defense, simply overpowered the Rockets in the 3rd period, as they fought hard to get back in contention on the scoreboard. Eventually that tenacity would pay off when the Tornadoes would make one in on a breakaway shot scored by Sean Smith(#14), with assist by Alex Britten(#3). Way to get things going, Sean! Tacoma's frustrations increased as the offense continued to hammer away at their goaltender with their defense unable to stop the Tornadoes persistent offensive onslaught. With just minutes left on the clock, Steven Rosenquist(#5) would score the Tornadoes final goal, with a spectacular shot almost at the blue-line, assisted by Drew Sherwood(#11) & Jake Ferguson(#8). Awesome shot, Steven! The Tornadoes did a tremendous job of keeping the puck deep in Tacoma's zone almost the whole period, DOMINATING puck possession time, and rattling off 11 remarkable shots on goal that period - all a result of pure grit and determination by all our boys. Although the Rockets battled

hard, they couldn't generate enough offense to even score during the period against the strong defense of the Tornadoes.

Summary - It's as close to a picture perfect comeback as a team can get - with the exception of not having home-ice advantage. But that didn't matter to the KVHA Tornadoes who mixed lots of offense and an almost perfect performance in goal by net minder Kyle Klem (#12). They took advantage of the Rocket's home ice and showed no mercy by out-shooting the Rockets with 16-8 shots on goal! Talk about a close match-up! Does it get any better than that? In the end, the exciting outcome of this game came down to the last seconds, with the Kent Valley Tornadoes ending in a tie against the Tacoma Rockets in league play on Sunday, by a final score of 2 to 2. Outstanding job on the offensive pressure and keeping the puck in their zone during the final period! The Tornadoes made a remarkable effort against a tough team and in the process, showed great grit and guts for the game! Kent goalie Kyle Klem (#12) did an amazing job, turning away Tacoma's 6 of 8 shots on goal, including a couple of threatening breakaways by the Tacoma offense. Outstanding performance, Kyle! The game may not have been our prettiest, but the refusal to quit and the determined comeback efforts in the 3rd were something to be proud of for sure, and are great signs of our team's potential and things to come!
