Squirt Tornadoes Overcome Kitsap Red Tide 5 to 2

Bremerton Ice Center, Bremerton, WA. October 13, 2012 – Coach Jeff Ferguson took his KVHA Tornadoes team to Bremerton Ice Center on Saturday for their second league game of the season to face-off against the West Sound Red. In another electrifying contest, the Tornadoes dominated the game with their solid performance and impressive teamwork, as the joy from last Saturday's win at home continued with a defeat of the Reds team!

Period 1 - The Tornadoes didn't waste any time in trying to gain the upper-hand, as the fight for control of the puck was intense throughout the period. The Tornadoes did an outstanding job on defense as well as offensive maneuvers and could have easily netted 2 or 3 goals were it not for the very impressive play of West Sound's goaltender. Unfortunately, the superior play did not equate to goals for either team as the first period came to a scoreless close.

Period 2 - The turbulent battle for possession continued well into the 2nd period with the Tornadoes scoring 3 consecutive, unanswered goals to make a strong impression on the Reds team. The first was an unassisted goal from Sean Smith (#14). A few minutes later, the Tornadoes lead was further extended by an unassisted goal from Steven Rosenquist (#5). The last was a quick, unassisted shot by Maxwell Mudge (#15) just seconds after the puck was dropped. Throughout the period, the Reds struggled to collect themselves against the dominance of the KVHA team. However, they did manage to net 1 goal before the close of the period, despite getting a penalty for checking.

Period 3 - The KVHA Tornadoes followed their 2nd period barrage with 2 more goals in the 3rd. As the 3rd period opened, their relentless offensive attack, coupled with their strong defense, simply overpowered the Reds in their attempts to mount an attack and get back in contention on the scoreboard. At 11:34 on the clock, Steven Bautista (#11) would score from an assist by Sean Smith (#14). In turn, the Reds scored once more but as the period closed, with seconds on the clock, Steven Rosenquist (#5) scored his second goal of the game with an assist from Reid Shelden (#3). Way to rally and keep the momentum going, boys!

Summary - The KVHA Tornadoes took advantage of the Red's home ice and showed no mercy by out-shooting the Reds with 15-7 shots on goal! The Tornadoes had a far more dominant game than West Sound's scorekeeper seemed to note, despite our much slower pace in the 2nd period. Sadly, there appeared to have been some scorekeeping difficulties throughout the game as reflected in the lack of shots on goals recorded (the Tornadoes certainly had over 20 shots during the game), not to mention the issues with the clock. However, in the end, the Tornadoes came out ahead to win a closely played match against the West Sound Red team in league play on Saturday afternoon by a final score of 5-2. Goalie Cameron Steinocher (#19) did an amazing job and turned away 5 of 7 shots to help earn the victory with a 71% save rate. Good job, Cameron! Hopefully next week, the Tornadoes can ride the "win" wave once again in a match against the SJHA Badgers at home. Good luck, Tornadoes!

Sprinker Ice Arena, Spanaway, WA. October 13, 2012 – In the second game of the season, the Kent Valley Tornadoes Pee Wee Rec team emerged victorious as they shut out the Tacoma Rockets (white) on their home ice with a final score of 4-0.

These two teams have a history as 4 of the current Rockets players and 3 of the Tornadoes players were on the same team as Squirts for the Tomahawks two years ago. Last season at the "Meat Locker" in Tacoma, the Tomahawks defeated the Tornadoes. Although the history

of this game or any significance was not discussed or brought to the attention of the team, it was a sweet victory none the less for those who do remember.

The Tornadoes started the game strong controlling the puck from the start and driving it deep into the Rockets zone and keeping it there for most of the game. The defense held the blue line and kept the puck in the offensive zone for most of the game. In those days you played games back to back, and it got to be so exhausting both physically as well as mentally. I was drained. Every team was big and physical, and you just got worn out. It was such a grind, I think I lost 10 pounds during the playoffs due to fatigue. I will never forget that epic Game 6 against Philadelphia, where we won it in overtime 5-4 on Bob Nystrom’s game winner to clinch it. What a relief. I honestly don’t know what I was more happy about, winning the Cup or just knowing that I wasn’t going to have to play anymore. I was totally spent.”

Editor’s note: Langevin served as head coach of the expansion WCHL Idaho Steelheads during the 1997–98 season. After a single season in Idaho he returned to Minnesota and became a real estate appraiser and high school hockey coach. He also served as a South Suburban (MnJHL) head coach until the team folded following the 2001–02 season. He has also done part-time work for the NHL Central Scouting Bureau after his retirement.

Langevin, who wore #26 for the Islanders, was inducted into the U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame in 1993.
