Squirt Tornadoes Beat SJHA Badgers in a Thriller 2-0

Lynnwood Ice Arena, Lynnwood, WA 16 October, 2010 – The Kent Valley Tornadoes beat the Seattle Junior Badgers 2-0 in a thrilling game which featured great goaltending, stellar defense, and some great open ice play. Action packed from the start, the two teams played scoreless hockey well into the third period before Danny Smith slipped into some open ice and buried a wrist shot to put the Tornadoes on top. Dylan Herzog added an insurance goal in the final minute to close the scoring.

The Badgers, draped in Red, and the Tornadoes, wearing their Ice Blue, played a terrific first period showing great energy and a desire to attack. The teams both worked hard to find lanes to the net, but were met with strong defense which kept play around the boards. Still, the Tornadoes, led on the opening face-off by the hard skating of game day captain Jake Sordahl, created more scoring chances and outshot the Badgers 11-3. Both goaltenders, Jackson Glassford for SJHA and Brett Jenkins for KVHA made strong stops and showed they were not going to give up anything easy. Glassford, in particular, had to be sharp and quickly established he was not going to be beaten low using a very effective butterfly.

In the second period both teams' defense made their mark on the game reducing shots on goal dramatically and making life miserable for attacking forwards. The Tornado defense corps – anchored by the gritty play of Noah Koester and Caed Kim – played brilliantly, shutting down the Badger attack at the blue line and forcing the rare puck carrier into the

zone wide of the net and with little time to load up and look for openings in the goal. Ben McQuage, Oliver Carlson, David Fjeld and Davis Herzog bring the added threat of being able to mount a counter attack out of the zone and get into center ice quickly. These boys are only beginning to see each other on the ice and it will be interesting to watch how they develop over the season.

When Seattle Junior was able to breach the "blue wall" of the Tornado defense, they had to contend with goaltender Brett Jenkins who stopped everything sent his way as well as playing Scrooge with the rebounds – refusing to give away second chances despite some tough saves. Brett has now played 6 periods of shut-out hockey.

After two scoreless periods, and it looking like a single goal would win the game, the forwards on the ice came out flying in the third. And whereas the blue wall of Tornado defense had been dominant in the second period it was the "blue wave" of offense in the third period which won the game. The Tornadoes mounted rush after rush into the offensive zone with several boys crashing down the wings and getting the puck on net. Lexi Doner Jr., Joey Geisnedorfer, Blake Britten, Kemper Terry and Jack Hanscom all made great individual efforts to get the puck on net during the third period. And Aaron Dunning, Nate Dunn, and Jessie Everson were active in front of the Badger net, creating traffic and cruising for rebounds.

However, it was Danny Smith who got the game winner. Danny – a terrific two way player with great vision – had tried just about everything to beat the Badger goaltender. His goal – with an assist from Oliver Carlson - was scored on a defensive lapse by the Badgers which left Glassford facing down a pair of Tornado skaters. Danny took full advantage of the space and time to place a hard wrist shot over the glove of the goaltender. Since Glassford had effectively taken away the lower part of the net through 2+ periods Danny's decision to go high was rewarded with the red light and the first team embrace of the day.

The Badgers immediately went to work to find the equalizer and created 2-3 minutes of pressure in the Tornado zone in what was their best sustained attack of the day. Jenkins made 3 huge stops in the space of 2 minutes to keep the Tornadoes clinging to their 1-0 lead. With one minute to go, the Tornadoes won a face-off in their own zone and were able to move the puck up to a hard charging Dylan Herzog who put the game away with 25 seconds left. Dylan's goal beat the goaltender low to the stick side and sent Dylan sprawling into the corner. Blake Britten helped twice on the goal – first with an assist and then with a hand up!

Seattle Junior players Jackson Glassford and George Daher distinguished themselves in this game – goaltender Glassford making one big save after another and forward Daher showing real creativity and speed when on the attack. This play, however, was not just limited to a few players as both teams played hard, clean, spirited hockey in front of appreciative coaches and parents. The two teams play again at Kent Valley on January 8th in what should be a great game.

The Tornadoes are now 2-0 in NPSHL league play. Next up for the Tornadoes is the SKAHA Jr. T-Birds Green who visit Kent Valley this Saturday, October 23rd at 8:00 AM.
