Comcast Community Ice Rink, Everett, WA. October 15, 2011 – Coach Robert Herring took his KVHA Tornadoes team to Comcast Community Ice Rink in Everett Saturday for their second league game of the season to face-off against the Everett Kodiaks. The joy from last Saturday's win at home was short-lived as the Tornadoes faced an inspired Kodiak team!

The Tornadoes went toe-to-toe in scoring during the 1st period matching each goal of the Kodiaks with one of their own. Minutes after the first Kodiak goal, the Tornadoes scored on a goal from Jake Ferguson(#6) with an assist from Conner Kirby(#1). In turn, the Kodiaks scored once more but as the period closed, with seconds on the clock, Jake Ferguson(#6) scored his second goal of the game with an assist from Maxwell Mudge(#15) and Quinton Gessner(#10).

The Kodiaks scored 3 more unanswered goals in the 2nd period to make a strong impression on the KVHA team. Throughout the period, the Tornadoes struggled to collect themselves against the dominance of the Kodiak team. JD Dunn Hat Trick Leads Kent Valley Tornadoes Past SnoKing Midget Green 9 to 1

October 15, 2011 – Kent Valley's Luke Blair, assisted by Erin Byrnes, may have begun the Tornadoes scoring early in the first period, but JD Dunn scored the game winning goal, his first of three, just five minutes later to spark the Tornadoes offense. Dunn went on to score the Tornadoes third goal, assisted by Neil Dhanda and Casey Brockes and the ninth goal for a Hat Trick, assisted by Paul Pinkoske. In between Dunn's last two goals, the Tornadoes got tallies from Brendan Laik, assisted by

Tanner Coughlin, a second goal from Luke Blair, assisted by Brendan Laik and Miles Hansen, and two unassisted goals from Paul Pinkoske and Tanner Coughlin.

Five of the Tornadoes' nine goals were scored by first-year Midgets. Not bad for players new to Midget Hockey. The rookie scoring bodes well for the future of Kent Valley Midget Hockey.

The Tornadoes fired 70 shots on Carson Graham, the SnoKing goaltender. One would think that might be a record for a KVHA team. But, it is not! The record for "Most Shots on Goal in a Single Game" is 81, set back on January 13th, 2008, by the Kent Valley Bantam Tornadoes 13 vs. Portland Bantam Ice Pirates 1, at Mountain View Arena in Vancouver, WA.

Miller-Smith was assisted by Kale Pokrzywinski and Jarid Rivers. Coquitlam scored the go-ahead goal, a power play goal, in the waning seconds of the first period and never looked back. Coquitlam went on to score 5 goals in the second, one power play and one shorthanded, and 2 more goals in the third for a final score of 9 to 1.

Kent Valley's Aaron Mathews faced 30 shots in the game while his teammates were only able to muster up 14 shots on the Coquitlam net. The Selects failed to score on six power play opportunities while Coquitlam converted for two goals on their four power play opportunities. The 9 to 1 margin of loss was the Selects' largest spread of the season.
