Connor Kirby scored the Tornados' lone goal early in the second period. Kirby won the faceoff in the defensive zone, carried the puck out of the zone, deked an opposing defenseman on his way to the Bulldogs net and beat the goalie up top. Kirby now has 8 points in three games. He joins Ryan Severson in team scoring honors. Severson scored 4 goals in the Tornados' last NPSHL league game when the Tornados defeated the Everett Squirt Grizzlies 13 to 1.

Jonathan Cairus scored Seattle Jr's only goal of the game, also in the second period. Cairus was assisted by Mollman. Each team had 2 minor penalties.

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. October 18, 2014** – On Saturday, the KVHA PeeWee Tornados hosted the Seattle Junior Badgers at Kent Valley Ice Centre and simply overpowered the Badgers, winning their third regular-season game at home by an impressive score of 8-0. As their moniker represents, the KVHA Tornados churned a chaotic storm with forceful winds ... agitating their opponents at every turn! While typically our first game of the season is chock-full of a whole bunch of "firsts", this one also made it into the record books with some outstanding notable "firsts" as well:

- 2nd-year PeeWee Michael Geddes scored his first hat trick ever and the first PeeWee goal of the game!
- 2nd-year PeeWee Steven Rosenquist had his first hat trick of the season!
- 1st year PeeWee C.J. Hundal had his first shut-out of the season!

Way to go, boys! It was these exceptional plays and the fury of their relentless attacks that lead the team to a thrilling victory of 8 to 0 – their first shutout for the NPSHL season!

**Period 1** - Just like the momentum of an F5 tornado, our Tornados didn't waste any time to evoke mass destruction on their opponent and defend their home ice as the game got off to a dream start for the Tornados. As the period began, the Tornados took full advantage of home ice and didn't waste any time to take the lead by scoring first on an unassisted goal from Michael Geddes. Nice shot, Mike! The intense battle for possession continued well into the period with both teams fighting hard for the puck. Midway through the period, the

Tornadoes took advantage of a power-play opportunity and extended their lead on another unassisted goal from Michael Geddes. Way to get the momentum going, Mike! The Tornadoes' strong defensive skills were put to the test as their goals would be the only ones scored in the period. Thus, frustrating the Badgers at every play and preventing them from even scoring to hold this lead to end the first. Great team work boys!

**Period 2** - The impassioned battle for the puck began right as the whistle blew and the first puck was dropped. It was apparent that frustrations affecting the Badgers in the first period had continued to plague them in the second as they once again had a difficult time fighting for possession of the puck and the Tornadoes took advantage. Because of this and their unyielding offensive attack, the Tornadoes were just too much and overpowered the Badgers. As a final blow, the Tornadoes took the opportunity to extend the lead even more when Michael Geddes netted one to complete his own "Hat Trick" with an unassisted shot past SJHA goalie Elias Ginder for the his 3rd goal of the night!
