



A New Team Record for the KVHA and PNAHA Record Books

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. October 25, 2012 – Speaking of records, this one is amazing. Adam Speer's Kent Valley Bantam Tier-II Selects played two PNAHA League games in Tri-Cities over the weekend. In Saturday's game, the Selects defeated the Tri-Cities Bantam Tier-II Jr. Americans 9 to 2, scoring 2 goals in the first period, 3 goals in the second period and 4 goals in the final period while the Jr. Americans scored 2 goals in the third period. But, that's not the record; Sunday's game is the record game.

Kent Valley faced off against the same Jr. Americans on Sunday and it was a whole different game. Kent Valley fired 30 shots on the Jr. Americans' net during the first and second periods and nothing made it past Carrington Nevard, the Ams goaltender; he was bullet proof. The second period ended with all zeros on the scoreboard. The Selects had outshot the Ams 30 to 8 but, as the third period began, it was anybody's game. That is, until 1:12 into the third when Elliot Plourde opened the flood gates with the game's first goal, assisted by Calen Randall. One minute and 14 seconds later Mikey Thomas scored from Dylan Moriarty and the Selects were headed for the record books. Kent Valley scored 10 goals between 1:12 and 12:52 of the third period and won the game 10 to 0.

Scoring 10 goals in one period establishes a new KVHA record. And, since it was a PNAHA League game, we're also calling it a PNAHA record.

Only one question remains: What was it that Coach Adam Speer said to his team during the break between second and third periods? We need to find out, bottle it and provide it to all of our coaches. It must have been a remarkably inspiring chat between Coach Speer and his team. Congratulations team!

Zamboni Breakdown Disrupts Weekend Ice Schedule

It was bad timing for the Zamboni to break down Friday afternoon just as a busy weekend of public skating and hockey was about to begin. Les Grauer, Kent Valley Ice Centre's Director of Operations, said; *"Often, when something is about to fail on the Zamboni you*

get some indication. Like a bearing will howl and you know you better plan a time to get it fixed before it breaks down. But, this was just one of those things where there was no warning; it just all of a sudden wouldn't start." Diagnosis took several hours. Grauer called in Kent Valley Midget Tier-II coach Jay Johnston, a seasoned auto mechanic, to help with the diagnosis. Initially, they thought it was the coil, but replacing the coil didn't solve the issue. Finally, Johnston suggested; "If it isn't the coil, it has to be the ignition block;" a small electronic black box. However, none were in stock locally but one supplier could have the replacement part available by noon Saturday.

Borrowing a Zamboni from ShoWare Center, just down the street, wasn't a reasonable alternative this particular weekend. ShoWare was using both of their Zambonis just to keep up with the needs of the Skate America event.

KVHA's Hockey Director, Danny Lorenz, contacted Gord Brown to cancel the Saturday morning series of NPSHL league games. Brown graciously offered to loan Kent Valley the backup Zamboni from SnoKing. Grauer explored arrangements to get the Zamboni transported to Kent Valley Ice Centre in the event the Saturday fix didn't work.

The replacement part arrived on Saturday as planned. Johnston installed the black box, hit the starter and the Zamboni fired right up. According to Grauer, "The whole process took less than five minutes once we had the correct part." The Zamboni was back in service in time for the Saturday "Learn to Skate" session.

Thank you **Coach Jay Johnston** for again coming to the rescue of the Zamboni. Thanks also to **Gord Brown at SnoKing** for offering the backup Zamboni. Thanks also to **Terry Becker at SnoKing** for his advice and consultation (Becker helps maintain the Zambonis at SnoKing.) Thanks to coaches, players and parents for your patience and cooperation. We make a great team...

TEAM – Together Everyone Achieves More! SnoKing's Gord Brown suggested all the local ice rinks put together an inventory of their Zamboni information, year and models, and human resources for future emergencies like this one. It would be much quicker to get back up and running if you could borrow a part from one of the other ice rinks rather than wait 24 hours for the part to arrive at the local parts store. Great idea Mr. Brown. Thanks!

The Selects were still reeling from last Saturday's game against SnoKing when they took the ice Saturday at Kingsgate Arena. The memory of a 5 to 0 lead evaporating on then in the second and third periods of that game weighed heavily on their minds. First period was scoreless for both teams as they matched each other shot for shot.
