### Kent Valley Mite Tornadoes Hold SnoKing Mite Major Green to 3 – 3 Tie in NPSHL Play

**Castle Ice Arena, Renton, WA 23 October, 2010** – Kent Valley's Mite Tornadoes played the SnoKing Mite Major Green team to a 3 to 3 tie Saturday at Castle Ice Arena. "Major" teams generally have an age advantage over other Mite teams by rostering the older players in the age division. The younger less experienced Mites play on "Minor" teams. Kent Valley's Mite team has players with birth years 2002, 2003 and 2004 while SnoKing's Major team is mostly 2002 birth year players. Thus the term Major.

Trevor Mertel scored two goals for the Tornados, both unassisted. Mertel's second goal was a power play goal. Chase Pagan scored the tying goal for the Tornados with assists from Zach Johnston and Ty Herring.

Kent Valley's Andrew Alonzo won the goal tending battle stopping 12 of 15 shots for an 80% save rate. SnoKing's Edvin Sanders faced 9 shot on goal stopping 6 for a save rate of 67%.

With this tie the Tornados slip to second place in NPSHL Mite Division with 8 points, just 1 point less than leader SnoKing Mite Grey at 9 points. However, the Tornados continue to lead the division in goals-for with 24, an average of 8 goals per game.

**Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA 23 October, 2010** – Down 3 to 0 and outshot 8 to 2 at the end of the first period the Kent Valley PeeWee Tornadoes refused to quit. The Tornadoes pulled it together in the second period and battled back to cut the margin to one goal by the end of the second. Kent Valley's Markus Dodd sparked the second period comeback with the scoring of his first career goal. Dodd was assisted by Nicholas Bennett. Less than three minutes later Anthony Alonzo continued the comeback as he scored the Tornadoes second goal with an assist from John Brockes. Alonzo's goal cut the Everett lead to two goals. Ben Lewis scored all alone near the end of the second to bring the Tornadoes within one goal of the Bruins.
