Tacoma, WA 25 October, 2008 – The Kent Valley PeeWee Hurricanes blew in to Tacoma Saturday, for a much anticipated game with the Puget Sound Tomahawks. First period scoring opened up with Tacoma putting a bobbling puck over the top of Aaron Mathews as he was scrambling to get out of a scrum going on in the crease. Tacoma's David Peters was awarded the goal at 8:26, with Brenden Sedgwick and Michael Welch earning assists. The Hurricanes answered with a power play goal at 3:42 by "Young Gun" Matt Saunders. The second period started as a physical one for both teams. Kent controlled the puck in Tacoma's zone for much of this period. Tacoma swapped goalies at the beginning of period 2, but at 8:20, Matthew Saunders proved it didn't matter who Tacoma put in the crease. Matthew got his second goal of the game off a sweet pass from Daniel Gill. Gill was awarded the assist on this goal. Then, at 6:27, Tacoma's Emily Grahn put the first of her 2 goals past 'Canes netminder Aaron Mathews. She was assisted by Aubanie Dubacher and Brenden Sedgwick. The 'Canes gathered up some penalties during this period and had to kill off a 5-on-3 at one point. Our boys played beautifully though, despite intense pressure from Tacoma's offense. They iced the puck, played good zone defense, and Matt Saunders even skated one down the ice and almost scored a shorthanded goal. Penalties were assessed to "Big" Kyle Pirttila at 13:15 for Roughing, Colin Bartlett at 3:09 for Tripping, and Daniel Gill at 1:43 for Slashing. The Tomahawk's Michael Welch earned a free pass to the sin bin at 9:29 for Hooking. Shots on goal in the period were 4 for Tacoma and 5 for the 'Canes. Despite being heavily penalized during this period, the Hurricanes clearly outplayed the Tomahawks.

Period 3 started out much like the 2nd, with physical play and trading of penalties. Tacoma's David Peters drew a Roughing call at 10:14, and got to watch our Mason Conner score his FIRST career goal on a 'Canes power play at 9:04, unassisted and *SWEETTTT!!!* Mason skated around two Tacoma defenders, and put the puck over the scrambling Tacoma goaltender. Way to go Mason!!! But, at 7:51, Matt Saunders got caught Slashing, so Tacoma went on their own power play. The 'Canes were looking good on the penalty kill, and then at 7:05, Tovi Beale got busted for Slashing. Now two 'Canes are in the box, and Tacoma has another 5 on 3 power play opportunity. Well, the Hurricanes were to deny Tacoma again, with Kent's Mathews making some great saves, including a beautiful weak side glove save that looked like a goal for sure. It looked like we had a victory in the bag, when disaster struck at :13 left in the game. Mason Conner got caught Boarding, and at the ensuing faceoff, Tacoma won, and pass, pass, BANG!, the score was tied 3-3. At :10 left in the game, Emily Grahn was awarded her second goal, assisted by Hayden Miller and David Peters. Shots on goal were tied at 8 for each team during the third period.

Friday October 24, 2008 – Some of you may or may not be aware of the PNAHA league rule in regards to game misconducts. The standard USA Hockey rule is that if a player receives a game misconduct, he is to automatically sit out the team's next game; this rule is always the case with no exceptions.

The "Double Jeopardy" rule applies when a player receives a game misconduct in an official PNAHA league game and the team's next game is not a league game. The player must end up sitting out two games....the next scheduled game to be played and the next official league game.

This also applies to the 15+ penalties for coaches....

There are currently four more league games on the Midget Tier-II schedule where this rule will apply.
