Teams Advisory Council - The Teams Advisory Council will address the specific and emergent issues related to the formation and perpetuation of Recreation and Representative/Tier teams. This is a current issue with KVHA members and needs to be addressed with urgency in order to avoid further erosion of KVHA membership.

Inspired by their team name and the blustery conditions outside, the KVHA Tornadoes were hoping to “get the winds a blowing” as they faced a confident and undefeated EYH Kodiak team (who had previously outscored their opponents 24-2 prior to the match). However, a forceful wind they did stir...and one to be reckoned with! In a whirlwind match, the inspired Tornadoes churned it up and came out victorious against a closely matched team to take the eventual win by a final score of 2 to 1!

Period 1 - The Tornadoes definitely faced a daunting task, having to face one of the very top teams in the league on their ice! But just as the first puck was dropped, the Tornadoes fought hard for possession of that elusive puck as they went toe-to-toe against a solid Kodiaks team during the 1st period. Unfortunately, midway into the period, the Tornadoes got out of position and the Kodiaks took advantage and would sneak in a goal. However, despite the 1-goal deficit, the Tornadoes didn't let that distract them from creating a rock-solid defense, preventing the Kodiaks from capitalizing even more and agitating their opponents at every turn!
