## ***Kent Valley Squirt Tornadoes Beat SJHA Blades, 7-2***

**Lynnwood Ice Arena, Lynnwood, WA 30 October, 2010** – The Kent Valley Squirt Tornadoes traveled to Lynnwood Ice Arena on Halloween for a Sunday morning battle between two unbeaten in the NPSHL Squirt division. The Tornadoes earned their first treat of the day with a convincing 7-2 win over the Seattle Junior Blades. Danny Smith and Jake Sordahl led the Tornadoes with two goals each, while Blake Britten, Davis Fjeld, and Jessie Everson each added goals for the Tornadoes. Jesper Miquel – making his first appearance between the pipes for the Tornadoes – earned his first win of the year.

The Blades jumped out to a quick 1-0 lead just 1 minute into the game as Cam Jennings found a puck sized hole in the butterfly of Miquel. The Tornadoes answered this goal with 6 straight. Danny Smith started the scoring on a breakaway just 2 minutes after the Blade goal. Jake Sordahl followed with a power-play goal at the end of a long rush. And Blake Britten was able to get away near the end of the period and slip the puck between the legs of the goalie, giving the Tornadoes a 3-1 lead at the end of 1. Second and third period goals were more the result of hard work in the offensive zone, rather than the breakaway opportunities, and the Tornadoes demonstrated some growing abilities in puck possession and creating a sustained attack with puck movement.

The Tornadoes are an interesting mix of experienced and first year players. While Coach Harry Smith continues to tinker with line combinations, the clear trend is to place the "seasoned" veterans like Danny Smith, Kemper Terry, Jake Sordahl, and Blake Britten in the center – allowing them to stir the pot in the offensive zone. This allows the Squirt rookies to fill the wings, where they can focus on positioning, chasing pucks on their own side, and setting up in the slot for one-timers when the puck is on the off-side. While this means less

pure output from the center men in terms of points, it translates into a much more dangerous attack as these players bring their wingers into the action.

This strategy paid off in the second when Jessie Everson scored the first goal of his career. With Danny Smith working hard on the fore-check, Jessie set himself just off the crease, ready for any centering attempt. Smith was able to wrest control of the puck, flip towards the middle – just out of the reach of the Blade goaltender – and Everson was able to hammer it home.

The Tornado Blue Wall continues to play effectively in the offensive zone, and brilliantly in the neutral zone. Led by game day captain Davis Fjeld, the Blades were only able to enter the Tornado zone with possession of the puck a handful of times. Davis played a very active role in the victory, assisting on the first goal by Smith and closing the scoring with an exciting rush, shot, goal with just 2 seconds left in the game.

Jesper Miquel stopped 7 of 9 and was very strong in the second period, using solid positioning and a big butterfly to keep the net free of pucks allowing the Tornados to build an insurmountable lead.

The Tornados play two this weekend – before a week off – defending home ice on Saturday morning versus KCHA Outlaws and traveling to Castle Ice on Sunday for the first game of a (extended) home and home series versus SnoKing Jr. T-Birds Blue.
