Then I read the background materials and quickly changed my mind. I'm all for it now! It makes sense. Baseball uses a smaller diamond for younger players, football uses a smaller field for beginners, basketball employs a lower basket for their young players and soccer uses a smaller ball, smaller playing surface and fewer team members for their younger teams. Dividing the ice in half and playing cross-ice hockey makes sense. It is very similar to our always popular spring and summer "3 on 3" cross-ice games.

The primary benefits of U8 Cross-Ice Hockey are:

- More puck touches
- Maximum ice utilization
- Increased competition for all the players
- Everyone is involved
- Fun for all participants
- Cost savings for parents

"For young kids, splitting up the ice does a lot more than make the rink smaller. Best of all, cross-ice hockey creates a positive environment and a passion for the game.
