Two New Honorable Mention Entries in the KVHA Record Book for Ethan McEneaney

Ethan McEneaney, Squirt Tornadoes, scored five goals during a game with the Tacoma Rockets Squirt White team. The Tornadoes won the game 8 to 0.

We checked Ethan McEneaney’s five goals against the KVHA Record Book to see if he had scored a record entry. Unfortunately, McEneaney fell a little short on timing. Kenneth Gill recorded the fastest five goals on record at 35 minutes exactly during a Mite game played in Lynnwood on November 15, 2008. McEneaney’s five goals occurred over 40 minutes and 34 seconds. Gill also holds the record for fastest four goals at 3 minutes and 10 seconds, fastest three goals at 1 minute and 22 seconds. McEneaney fell short on all those. However, McEneaney’s scoring of five goals in one game is none the less worth honorable mention in the KVHA Record Book under the Fastest Five Goals and Most Goals Records.
