Attention Scorekeepers; What Counts as a "Shot on Goal?"

My grandson Chad played in a Junior game over the weekend where his team outshot their opponent 81 to 25. Having followed Chad's team for two seasons I know that they typically get an unusually high number of shots on their opponent's goal. However, 81 shots is pretty high and it makes me wonder who was counting and what they were counting. A total of 106 shots on goal means there was an average of 1.8 shots on goal every minute of the game. Really?

For the record, here are some guidelines on how to count "shots on goal:"

1. There is no specific definition or rule of a shot on goal. But in general terms, a shot on goal is a shot that is taken that either goes into the net for a goal or the goalie prevents (saves) from going into the net for a goal. A shot that hits the goalpost or crossbar, or a shot the goalie stops that would not have gone in the net (wide or high) is not considered a shot on goal.
2. Not every shot directed towards the net is a shot on goal. For example, a shot that is intended towards goal but is blocked by another player is not a shot on goal. Any shot that is intended towards the net but misses the net or hits the posts or the crossbar is also not counted as a shot on goal. A shot on goal that is rebounded by the goalie and then pulled in and covered by the goalie is only counted as one shot on goal, not two.
3. In short, a shot that enters the net or would have entered the net if it had not been blocked by the goalkeeper is considered a "shot on goal."

Typically, for our purposes anyway, shots on goal are counted by the score keeper with help from the penalty box operators. Regardless of who is counting them, the score keeper should make it clear to everyone what should and should not be counted as a shot on goal. Just because a shot was directed in the vicinity of the net does not necessarily mean it was a "shot on goal." Happy counting...

The game featured three Hat Tricks, two by Ripken Renner and G'bari Mayers of the Kent Valley Tornadoes and one by Dylan Berger of SnoKing Grey.

In addition to Hat Tricks by Renner and Mayers, Luke Pizzey (2), Connor Kirby (2), Ben White, and Mason Hainsworth also scored goals for the Tornadoes. Ryan Severson, Isabelle White, Ben White (2), Ripken Renner, G'bari Mayers, Mason Hainsworth and Savannah Dunn earned assists. Easton Wagner stopped 9 of 12 shots on goal for a 75% save rate for the Tornadoes and earned the win. It's worth noting that Ripken Renner's four goals and one assist gave him the scoring honors for the game with a total of five points. The Tornadoes scored 4 goals in the first period, 4 in the second and 5 in the third and outshot SnoKing Grey 25 to 12.

Kingsgate Ice Arena, Kirkland, WA. November 2, 2014 – As dawn broke for an o-dark-early game on Sunday, November 2nd, the KVHA Tornado caravan rolled into Kirkland to face a confident Sno-King Blue team in league play. Unfortunately, the match-play didn't go as they expected. Instead of getting a "W", the Tornadoes faced an extremely inspired team on their opponent's home ice and the joy from last Saturday's win at home was soon short-lived! Throughout the match, the Tornadoes seemed a bit off their usual focus and spirit from the get go – causing Ferguson and his team to come away with their first loss of the season after a persistent attack by the Sno-King Blues who eventually got the upper-hand to snag the win.

Period 1 - Just as the first puck was dropped, there was something dramatically different about this game! Perhaps it was the frigid, crisp nature of the arena (due to broken heaters) that was mixed with a competitive air that seemed to churn. Or perhaps it was the snappy, new KVHA jerseys worn by each of our ice warriors. In any case, the Tornadoes were in fact skating noticeably slower than usual, appearing to be missing their usual top gear and dogged determination as they went against the Sno-King Blue team during the 1st period. In fact, Sno-King Blue came out full of energy and were clearly ready to defend their home ice. In the end, the strong exchange between both teams prevented either team from scoring, as they had to settle for a scoreless tie as the period came to a close! Great performance by both teams and their net-minders!

Period 2 - The 2nd period was highlighted with a heated battle for possession and persistent attacks from both teams. Unfortunately, the Blues were first to find the net and put a score on the board. However, that just proved to be a motivating factor for the Tornadoes! After fighting some more over the puck, the Tornadoes would find an opportunity to get on the scoreboard with a quick, rebounded goal by Maxwell Mudge, assisted by the pair of cousins (Sean Smith and Caleb Chaloner).
