



KVHA News – Try Hockey for Free Event a Great Success for KVHA

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. November 7, 2013 – KVHA staff were overwhelmed and pleased by the turnout Sunday for our first “Try Hockey for Free” event. Over 50 boys and girls turned out to give hockey a try for free. Danny Lorenz, KVHA’s Hockey Director, reported this week that 5 of the 50 have registered for KVHA’s Learn to Play Hockey program.

KVHA has considered participation in USA Hockey’s “Try Hockey for Free” event in prior years but was unable to pull it off for a variety of reasons. This year, we were bound and determined to make it happen. However, it was not without its challenges. Kent Valley Ice Centre was able to provide ice time on Sunday the 3rd but not Saturday the 2nd. When we finally confirmed the November 3rd date USA Hockey asked us to move to the sanctioned date of November 2nd. We explained that ice time was not available and pleaded for permission to go ahead with the Sunday date. USA Hockey agreed and we were off and running.

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. - A record 12,602 boys and girls participated in USA Hockey's Try Hockey for Free Day last Saturday (Nov. 2). A total of 486 locations, representing 48 states, put on events that provided free equipment and a chance to experience youth hockey for the very first time.

Two Hat Tricks, no Penalties and a Shutout Make a Perfect Game for the Kent Valley PeeWee Tornadoes

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. November 2, 2013 – What do you get when you toss a puck down between two teams of ice warriors? An ice duel seen like no other as the Tornadoes took full advantage of their home ice once again on Saturday, November 2nd when they faced a confident, EYH Grizzly team! As their moniker represents, the KVHA Tornadoes churned a chaotic storm with forceful winds ... agitating their opponents at every turn! It was the kind of game where if you turned away for a second, you'd miss another spectacular shot. While typically our first game of the season is chock-full of a whole bunch of "firsts", this one also made it into the record books with some outstanding ones as well - such as 2nd year PeeWees Alex Britten(#3) & Lane Eriks(#19) scoring their first hat tricks of the season! It was these exceptional plays and the fury of their relentless attacks that lead the team to a thrilling victory of 8 to 0 – their second shutout for the NPSHL season!

Period 1 - Just like the momentum of an F5 tornado, our Tornadoes didn't waste any time to evoke mass destruction on their opponent and defend their home ice as the game got off to a dream start for the Tornadoes. As the period began and the tensions built, both teams fought hard for possession of that elusive puck as they went toe-to-toe in the 1st period. Half-way into the period, Steven Rosenquist(#5) made a long rush up the ice, slid quickly to the right of the goaltender and netted a sweet wrist shot to score the first goal of the game, assisted by Rickey Campbell(#4) & Nate Dunn(#9). The intensity of their storm would be magnified only minutes later when Alex Britten(#3) scored with an assist by Jack Jones(#24). It was yet another impressive team effort displayed by the Tornadoes with superior defense skills being matched with inspiring offensive maneuvers. The Tornadoes carried the play for most of the 1st period, outshooting the Grizzlies 10-2. Because of this domination, they held the lead as the period ended, preventing the Grizzlies from even scoring. Great teamwork, boys!

Period 2 - The Tornadoes quickly got back to work as the 2nd period opened in this heated contest. The turbulent battle for the puck and the intensity at which both teams played was of epic proportion. This was evident as the Tornadoes went into action and scored again to widen the lead on two consecutive goals by Lane Eriks(#19) – his first, an unassisted breakaway goal; that only to be followed by another goal at ~6 minutes into play, assisted by Alex Britten(#3). Great shots, Lane! The offensive onslaught kept coming when only a few minutes later, the Tornadoes lead was further extended by another goal. This time it was a spectacular upper-net shot from Alex Britten(#3) – his second of the game, assisted by Steven Rosenquist(#5) & Rickey Campbell(#4). Impressive goal, Alex! Because of this domination, they held the lead as the period ended, preventing the Grizzlies from even scoring and keeping their 5-0 lead. Way to go!

Period 3 - The 3rd period began the same way the previous ones had played - with the power of a massive storm packing hurricane-force winds along with raging conditions that induce insurmountable frustrations on their opponents. The Tornadoes swept through the rink, annihilating their challenger at every turn. At only 40 seconds into the 3rd period, Steven Rosenquist(#5) would score another Tornadoes goal, with an amazing shot, assisted by Jake Ferguson(#8) & Drew Sherwood(#11). And the hits just kept on coming.....when Lane Eriks(#19) would take the breakaway shot and score to complete his "Hat Trick", assisted by Maxwell Mudge(#15). With just under 1 minute left on the clock (and not wanting the scoring blitz to stop), Alex Britten(#3) would complete his own "Hat Trick" with an unassisted shot past EYH goalie Will Kern for the his 3rd goal of the night! WOW, Lane

and Alex! Our hats are literally off for to both of you! And talk about squelching the mighty growl of the Grizzlies!

Summary - This match was as close to a picture perfect game as a team can get! The Kent Valley Tornadoes had home-ice advantage, lots of offense and a perfect performance in goal by net minder Tyler Roberts(#35), who earned an incredible shut-out performance! The Tornadoes' offense outfired the Grizzlies by 17 shots on goal. Talk about a storm! Does it get any better than that? In the end, the Tornadoes dominated the game with their strong skills and impressive playmaking shots to take the eventual win with a final score of 8 to 0.
