



# Kent Valley's Zac Cadiente, Scores Amazing Shorthanded Hat Trick – Yes, Shorthanded!

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA – KVHA News for 11 November, 2010 – There was a little sticky note attached to a Midget Tornadoes' score sheet sitting on my desk Monday afternoon. It read; "Goals – It looks like 3 were shorthanded." I carefully analyzed the score sheet. Yeah, Kent Valley's Jared Prado was in the penalty box for high sticking when Kent Valley scored their first goal of the game, Tommy Peebles was in the box for roughing when Kent Valley's third goal was scored and Tanner Coughlin was incarcerated when Kent Valley's fourth goal was scored. Okay, three shorthanded goals in one game. Wow! It's pretty remarkable in a 4 to 2 game when 3 of the 4 goals by the winning team are scored shorthanded. Suddenly; remarkable became truly amazing as I realized that all three shorthanded goals were scored by the same player, Zac Cadiente. Now that is beyond remarkable! It's almost unbelievable! I rechecked the score sheet a second, third and fourth time. Yes, Cadiente scored a rare Shorthanded Hat Trick.

It is worth noting that Cadiente's third shorthanded goal was scored unassisted because it was scored on a Penalty Shot. It should also be noted that Neil Dhanda set up Cadiente for his first shorthanded goal and Jared Prado assisted on the second shorthanded goal.

## How rare is a Shorthanded Hat Trick?

Shorthanded Hat Tricks are indeed very rare. My research indicates that only one Shorthanded Hat Trick has been scored in NHL history. Theoren Fleury is the only NHL player in history to score a Shorthanded Hat Trick. Fleury accomplished that feat in an 8-4 Calgary win over St. Louis on March 9, 1991.

Only six Shorthanded Hat Tricks have been recorded in NCAA Division I college hockey. The most recent of those was scored by Minnesota State University forward Zach Harrison (must be something about the name) in a 5-1 victory over North Dakota on October 18, 2008.

The Canadian Hockey League, made up of the Western Hockey League, Ontario Hockey League and Quebec Major Junior Hockey League, reports only five Shorthanded Hat Tricks in their record book:

- Mike Hoffman, Brantford Alexanders, OHL, December 26, 1982 at Guelph
- David Bruce, Kitchener Rangers, OHL, January 6, 1984 vs. Cornwall
- Calvin Knibbs, Tri-City Americans, WHL, January 31, 1990 vs. Spokane
- **Glen Goodall, Seattle Thunderbirds, WHL, January 27, 1990 at Victoria**
- Peter Schaefer, Brandon Wheat Kings, WHL, March 14, 1997 at Brandon

So, there you have it. A Shorthanded Hat Trick is indeed extremely rare! Therefore, I hereby confirm that Zac Cadiente's truly amazing accomplishment on November 7, 2010, in Kent Valley Tornadoes' 4 to 2 win over the Seattle Jr. Blades is Kent Valley Hockey Association's first ever Shorthanded Hat Trick and it belongs in KVHA's Official Record Book! Congratulations to Zac Cadiente!

**Kingsgate Ice Arena, Kirkland, WA 7 November, 2010** – The Kent Valley Squirt Tornados beat the SnoKing Jr. T-Birds Blue 7-1 in a strong display of skating, passing, and crisp defensive work. The Tornados, whose team play is developing quickly, brought a pass first, shoot second mentality to the game which resulted in several beautiful attacks on the opposing zone and some memorable goals.

SnoKing goaltender Marah Wagner started the game in fine form turning away both Danny Smith and Lexi Doner Jr. on breakaways, using a combination of great glove work and nifty use of the stick. Wagner – a strong skater – forced the Tornados to work hard and spread the zone in order to find some open net. Davis Fjeld showed the way at the 2:10 mark by carrying the puck into the slot and sliding a beautiful backhand pass over to Doner who was filling the lane on the right side. Lexis was able to power direct the puck into the net and the Tornados were off and running.

Jake Sordahl continued his fine season by scoring an unassisted goal just 1 minute later. Jake scored twice on the day – and added an assist. The third goal was scored by Jessie Everson following up on some hard work in the crease by Blake Britten. But the fourth goal of the game set a new mark of excellence for this team.

The T-Birds cleared the puck into the Tornado zone – and were giving chase - but Ben McQuage, using his smooth, steady skating stroke reeled the puck in and – head up – took the puck around the back of his own net. As players from both teams crashed into the Tornado zone, Danny Smith, calmly pulled up to center ice and rapped his stick on the ice two times, the first getting McQuage's attention, and the second giving him the range. Ben having just passed his own red line let go with a long, delicate 100 foot bullet down the boards which Danny, moving backwards and quickly approaching the blue line, guided to the tape of his stick. Danny gained possession and whirled into the offensive zone – onside – and with a full head of steam. He pulled the goaltender out of the goal, held the puck,

and slid it into the net to complete the Tornado 200 (the length of the ice) in grand form. The Tornadoes ended the first period 4-0.

As with the game on Saturday the second period was tight and only resulted in one goal for the Tornadoes. Jake Sordahl got the play going with rush down the right side which Wagner turned away, but which resulted in a big rebound in front of the open net. Kemper Terry was there and made no mistake – burying the goal for his second of the season.

SnoKing was able to find the back of net in the third period – the only goal the Tornadoes were to allow in 2 games over the weekend – but Dylan Herzog got that one back quickly with one of his trademark runs. Dylan – a first year player – is having a wonderful freshman year and plays with a confidence and determination well beyond his experience.

Brett Jenkins picked up the win for the Tornadoes, going to 4-0 between the pipes for the Tornadoes and driving down his GAA this year to a miserly .75.
