



KVHA News – Mudge and White Commit to Co-Chair KVHA Auction

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. November 13, 2014 – Kent Valley members Jill Mudge and Tammy White have agreed to co-chair the KVHA Auction for 2014/2015. Mudge and White have already reviewed previous auctions and feel confident in taking on the huge task. Mudge said, *"I have been a volunteer for the Kent Valley Auction for numerous years and feel I know what we need to be successful."* The pair has prepared an Auction Flyer that will go out to teams next week.

One of the first tasks Mudge and White will tackle is nailing down a venue for the auction. Mudge said, *"We really need to secure a date and venue by November 18th."*

At the request of Mudge and White KVHA President, Lew Sellers, outlined goals for the 2014/2015 auction:

- Goalie gear for Mites and Squirts.
- Cover the balance due on Jersey purchase.
- Increase the KVHA "Fund a Player" account.
- Cover any shortfall in fees for 14/15.
- Build a rainy day reserve for the future.
- We'd like to get net auction revenues back above the \$30,000 figure. We've been declining the past few years.
- We'd like everyone to feel good about the auction and what it does for the hockey association. We realize this is a lofty goal.

Ticket Purchase Deadline: KVHA Registrar, Rena Sullivan, reported earlier this week that approximately 35% of KVHA members have met the November 10th deadline for ticket purchases. Procurement Deadline: December 10th is the next deadline. This is the deadline for turning in your auction procurement item with a minimum value of \$100. Or, you can Opt Out for \$250 cash. The Opt Out fee goes up to \$300 after December 10th.

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. November 8, 2014 – Last week's stinging loss, along with Coach Ferguson's advice that "You have to be in it, to win it!" (to encourage them to get their heads in the game), must have made a lasting impression on the KVHA PeeWee Tornadoes as they hosted the Tacoma Rockets at Kent Valley Ice Centre on Saturday, November 8th. In fact, Coach F. decided to "up the ante" by offering up an "ice cream incentive" for a no SOG game – and boy did our boys deliver by simply overpowering the Rockets to win their sixth regular-season game! While typically our first game of the season is chock-full of a whole bunch of "firsts", this one also made it into the record books with some outstanding ones as well - such as 1st year PeeWees Blake Hopkins & Brandyn White scoring their first goals EVER! It was these exceptional plays and the fury of their relentless attacks that lead the team to a thrilling victory of 12 to 0 – their second shutout for the NPSHL season! Period 1 – Just like the momentum of an F5 tornado, our Tornadoes didn't waste any time to evoke mass destruction on their opponent, as the game got off to a dream start for the Tornadoes. At 3-minutes into the period, Michael Geddes made a long rush up the ice, slid quickly to the right of the goaltender and netted a sweet wrist shot to score the first goal of the game, assisted by Zach Johnson & Steven Rosenquist. The intensity of their storm would be magnified only minutes later when Jake Ferguson scored with an assist by Steven Rosenquist. Seconds later, Caleb Chaloner would join the scoring action, assisted by Steven Rosenquist & Jake Ferguson. And to round out the scoring action, rookie Blake Hopkins would score his first goal as a hockey player, assisted by Maxwell Mudge. It was yet another impressive team effort displayed by the Tornadoes with superior defense skills being matched with inspiring offensive maneuvers. The Tornadoes carried the play for most of the 1st period, outshooting

the Rockets 9-0. Because of this domination and with extraordinary defensive skills, they held the lead as the period ended, preventing the Rockets from even scoring. Great teamwork, boys!

Period 2 – The Tornadoes quickly got back to work with the scoring blitz as the 2nd period opened in this heated contest. Jake Ferguson opened the period with a goal, getting the assist from Michael Geddes. A few minutes later, two quick goals added to the score - the first from Maxwell Mudge with an assist by Sean Smith; and then one by Tyler Sherwood, with an assist by Michael Geddes. But that only marked the beginning of the successive onslaught of goals as the hits just kept on coming against the Rockets. Defenseman Zack Johnson got into the act with a goal of his own as well, assisted by Jake Ferguson. And to round off the offensive bombardment, Brandyn White would score his first goal as a PeeWee, assisted by Michael Geddes. Within a 10-minute time span, the Tornadoes quickly extended their lead with outstanding play-making moves.....and with superior defensive skills, they once again prevented the Rockets from even scoring, keeping their 9-0 lead heading into the final period. Kent Valley Rainiers 16U Tier 1 Go Undefeated in Chicago Bauer World Invite Preliminary Round Games

Bauer World Invitational, Chicago, IL. November 9, 2014 – The Kent Valley Rainiers 16U AAA Tier-1 hockey team surprised many going undefeated in preliminary round games at the Bauer World Invite in Chicago this weekend. With a record of 2-0-1 versus AAA competition from around the country, the Rainiers earned a second place finish in their pool after losing out on the tie-breaker for first by a single goal.

The Bauer World Invitational Hockey Tournament is one of the largest in the world with AAA teams from all over North America and Europe competing in the Squirt 10U through Midget 16U age brackets. This year's event included 438 teams from 30 states, 7 Canadian provinces, and 8 other countries. It was a good showing for the Kent Valley 16U team that has a roster made up of a majority of players who are 15-year-olds, first-year Midgets.

In the first game of the tournament, Andrew Bell scored two first period goals to lead the Rainiers to a strong start, including one with :08 left in the period to knot the score at 2-2. After falling behind in the second period, Kyle Katras got the game-tying goal in the third to salvage an important point in the standings for the Rainiers. Calen Randall and Nick Snyder each had two assists in the game. Erik Garber made 12 saves on 15 shots.

By the time the Rainiers faced the Phoenix Firebirds in Game 2, they were firing on all cylinders. Controlling the game from start to finish, the Rainiers were paced by AP Tremblay's two goals. Dylan Moriarty and Michael Morrison had one goal and one assist each, while Calen Randall chipped in with a goal of his own. Elliot Plourde and Kyle Katras had two assists each, while Tom Speer, Dawson Myers, Mikey Thomas, Andrew Bell, and Ryan Donlan each contributed one helper. It was a dominating performance by the Rainiers who played a relentless puck pursuit style that suffocated the Firebirds throughout. Ben Jarvis earned the shutout making 19 saves on 19 shots.

Game 3 saw the Rainiers handle a tough, physical Pittsburgh Selects team 4-2. This time Elliot Plourde recorded two goals, including the game-clinching empty-netter. AP Tremblay and Calen Randall each tallied for the Rainiers, while Nick Snyder and Dylan Moriarty each had two assists, and Kyle Katras one. Erik Garber made 22 saves on 24 shots.

In the Sweet 16 elimination round the Rainiers faced the daunting prospect of playing the TPH Thunder of the Tier One Elite League who had given up only 2 goals for the entire tournament. Unfortunately for the Rainiers, that strong defense and goaltending held up. It was an evenly played game, with shots on goal level at 21-20, but the stiflingly efficient Thunder scored 3 goals in an 8:00 stretch of the second period, capitalizing on small but costly Rainier breakdowns. The old adage, "one mistake and the puck is in the back of the net," was true to form, as outside of those few errors the Rainiers played nearly flawless hockey, but just could not crack the impenetrable Thunder defense. Ben Jarvis made 18 saves on 21 shots.

"After having a tough weekend in Kelowna two weeks ago, our guys are starting to buy-in to what we are trying to do. The results are clear and we look forward to continuing to

develop our young team into better hockey players," remarked Head Coach Danny Lorenz. "It's a process."

Quote of the Day!

The True Meaning of Winning the Cup:

"Winning the first one is always the most special. I was just a 21-year-old kid at the time so it was pretty amazing—especially sweeping the 'Broad Street Bullies' on Philly's home ice. I remember just before that last game got underway the Flyers brought in Kate Smith to sing 'God Bless America.' Now, they had never lost a playoff game when Kate sang that song, and their fans were jacked. It was so loud in there you couldn't hear yourself think. It was already the most hostile environment to play in, and now they added this. We knew that [we] were going to have our work cut out for us that night, no doubt about it. Well, we wound up surviving and clinching the Cup, but the best part came on the flight home when our goalie, Kenny Dryden, handed out sheet music to 'God Bless America' for all of us to sing. So here we were, the Montreal Canadiens singing 'God Bless America' as we flew back to Canada. It was just classic, we had officially stolen their song."
