



KVHA News – Seattle Tunderbirds Provide Entertainment Value for KVHA Members

Kent Valley Ice Centre, Kent, WA. November 14, 2013 – The Seattle Thunderbirds are in a five-game losing slide after a magnificent and inspiring start to their season. While this current slide is as frustrating for fans as it is for the Birds themselves, it will most certainly pass. They are a bigger, faster and stronger team than last season’s team and they will most certainly overcome the current slump.

The Thunderbird’s record is 11 wins, 8 losses and 2 OT losses. They are in seventh place in the 10-team Western Conference. The Western Conference appears to be the strongest of the two Canadian Hockey League Conferences.

Sixty percent (15) of the Seattle Thunderbirds were with the team last season and forty percent (10) are new to the Birds. The team consists of 3 - 20 year olds, 9 - 19 year olds, 4 - 18 year olds, 6 – 17 year olds and 3 – 16 year olds. They are 19 Canadians, 4 Americans and 2 Europeans. Seventeen of them are six foot or taller. Austin Douglas is the tallest Bird at 6’6” with Mitch Elliot, Kevin Wolf and Jared Hauf each measuring 6’5”. Scott Eansor is the shortest Bird at 5’8”. Thirteen Birds weigh in at over 200 pounds. Three players have been drafted by NHL teams. They are; Branden Troock (Dallas 2012), Alexander Delnov (Florida 2012) and Shea Theodore (Anaheim 2013).

Castle Ice Arena, Renton, WA. November 9, 2013 – Kent Valley’s Squirt Tornadoes got a big win last weekend as they defeated the SnoKing Squirt Green 7 to 5 in NPSHL League play on the road. Kent Valley’s Caleb Chaloner led his Tornadoes to victory scoring 5 of the Tornadoes’ seven goals. Along the way, Chaloner was assisted by G’bari Mayers, Carson Kohler and Connor Kirby. Two of his goals were unassisted. Jeret Scott scored his first ever goal, a power play goal, assisted by Ema Wallace. Connor Kirby scored the Tornadoes’ first goal of the game with an assist from Austin Logue.

Luke Pizzezy was in goal for the Kent Valley Tornadoes. Pizzezy stopped 18 of 23 shots for a save rate of 78%. The Tornadoes skated the game free of penalties.

Kent Valley PeeWee Tornadoes Dominate West Sound PeeWee Black with 11 to 1 NPSHL Win

November 12, 2013 – This week's turbulent forecast called for the Tornadoes to take a road trip – as this past Saturday, November 9th, the Tornado caravan rolled into Bremerton and prepared for the 2:15 draw against the WSHC Warriors Black. In another spectacular show of boundless optimism and fearless ambition, the Tornadoes dominated the game with their rock-solid performance and extraordinary teamwork, as they crushed the Blacks team with an 11-1 defeat! Talk about making an impression and punctuating it by a resounding win!!

Period 1 - As the first puck dropped, the anticipation of another great hockey game was almost palatable! Even after the first face-off, the fierce competitiveness displayed by both teams was overtly apparent. However, the Tornadoes didn't waste any time to take the lead by scoring on a sweet, unassisted goal from Lane Eriks(#19) to start things off. Midway through the period, the momentum shifted in favor of the Tornadoes when 3 consecutive goals would be scored in about 30 seconds! The first was a solid shot by Drew Sherwood(#11), assisted by Steven Rosenquist(#5). Only 17 seconds later, the second goal was scored by Alex Britten(#3), assisted by Lane Eriks(#19). And only 16 seconds after that goal, the final one scored as a slingshot from near the blue line by Drew Sherwood(#11) – his second of the night. Way to rally, boys! Not to be outdone and with only seconds left in the period, Lane Eriks(#19) would score his second goal of the night, assisted by Steven Rosenquist(#5). The Tornadoes simply owned the period and overpowered the Blacks at every turn – preventing them from mounting an attack and even getting on the scoreboard with their strong defense and overwhelming shots by scoring 5 goals in the period! Go TEAM!

Period 3 - As frustrations mounted for the Blacks, the KVHA Tornadoes would not let up and continued their relentless offensive attack on the Black's goalie. Within minutes of play, Maxwell Mudge(#15) would score his first goal of the season, assisted by Steven Rosenquist(#5). Unfortunately, the Tornadoes let down their guard a bit and allowed the Blacks to score on a breakaway shot. But that wouldn't deter the Tornadoes who quickly got back in the game! Just moments later, the referees would call an Interference penalty on the Blacks and give the Tornadoes a penalty shot play. The Tornadoes took advantage when Jake Ferguson(#8) was tagged to make the attempt and would score an amazing shot, his first goal of the season! Great job, Jake! With true determination (and not to be outdone by his older brother), Tyler Sherwood(#2) would net an awesome goal, scoring on a quick rebound, assisted by Michael Geddes(#7). Then, in a déjà vu moment from last week, Lane Eriks(#19) would complete another "Hat Trick" this week with an unassisted power-play goal for the his 3rd goal of the night! We should call you "Mr. Hat Trick", Lane! ☐ Not wanting the onslaught of scoring to end, Rickey Campbell(#4) would score his first goal of the season by netting one in the waning minutes of the game. While the Tornadoes could've coasted through period with their 6-0 lead, they chose to dig deep and grind out more goals to add to their score. At almost 2-minute intervals, the Tornadoes seemed to do the unimaginable and score a goal throughout the period – ending the third with 5 more to add to their lead!

Summary - With each passing week, it is truly incredible to see the Tornadoes solidify their presence as a team and work on their positional play - both of which continue to see marked improvement....hence the saying, "Teamwork Makes The Dream Work"! While two ice warriors met in Bremerton, the true "warriors" were the KVHA Tornadoes who dealt a striking blow to the WSHC Warriors Black team by capturing a remarkable win by a final

score of 11-1! With two Black's goalies trying to cover the net, it was no match for the Tornadoes who found another gear and came up with the BIG win! The superior play of the Tornadoes basically dominated the Blacks on their home ice from the get-go. Goalie Tyler Roberts (#35) did an astounding job and turned away 10 of 11 shots to help earn the victory with a 91% save rate. Great work, Tyler!
